School Improvement Goals

Fall MAP Data

State School Report Cards

The Illinois State School Report Cards are to be released to the public on October 27 at 9:00 a.m. by the Illinois State Board of Education. Until that time, the District may not release any information contained within the report card. The upcoming Annual Report will have summations of data points from both the Report Card and recent MAP scores for the community's review.

2022 Student Interventions

This year, the District recognized the need to maintain and enhance intervention services to students in reading and mathematics. Utilizing Mrs. Nanci Greene as an Elementary Mathematics Interventionist has been helpful, in particular with the students in grades 3 and 4. Paper, the online tutoring service, has been carried over into this school year to support students inside and outside of school primarily in writing and mathematics. The Multi-Tiered Systems of Supports team introduced AIMSWEB assessments in fluency and mathematics to progress monitor students, especially those identified as needing Tier 2 or Tier 3 interventions. AIMSWEB can be administered by the classroom teacher or interventionist to see if a particular instructional method being used is helping in a student's academic growth.

Early Childhood Construction Grant

Earlier this month, the District submitted a grant application to the Illinois Capital Development Board for the purpose of acquiring funds to build an Early Childhood Center to serve the needs of students in prekindergarten and kindergarten programs. Should this grant be awarded to the District, it would allow for full day kindergarten programming to be offered to all District 13 parents for the first time. If the Capital Development Board does not approve the grant application, other means will be sought to provide full day kindergarten sometime in the near future.
