


- Great improvement in chronic absenteeism rate over the last three years




- Structure of C day planning has been modified to address deficits found within our data

- Strong ratings in effective leaders and collaborative teachers











- Good growth in ELA and Math

- Implemented 2 intervention times each day to address areas of need


















- Proficiency in ELA and Math improved significantly from previous years

- Increased teacher collaboration time for 24-25 during required staff meeting time to meet with PDS/MTSS











- Large improvement in overall score; score improvement for all subgroups

- Chronic absenteeism is improving


- Growth scores are up across the board









- Supporting students by teaching the underpinnings and staying on pace with the scope and sequence

- We expect that our growth will continue as we continue to refine and use additional strategies during intervention time

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
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
#### **Key Takeaways**

- We are seeing growth in collaboration and support










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- Chronic Absenteeism is down from the previous school year, but still an area of focus. We have monthly meetings with truancy to determine what supports we can put in place for families
- Collaborative teachers is a large area of focus for us this year. We are implementing peer observations, as well as providing time for teams to meet to increase collaborative efforts
- Students needing Tier 3 reading support has decreased from previous years. We believe the continued LETRS training is supporting students in this area.







- Moved from Comprehensive to Commendable

- Science proficiency up by 7%.


- Continue to work on building relationships with students to create a supportive learning environment.
- Overall, down 28 percent in students receiving disciplinary referrals. Class of 2029 are down 38% for Q1.
- DLM students had an increase in their ELA scores.





- Four Year Graduation Rate for the Class of 2024 was 85%, up from 79.5% last year and 81.2% the year before.
  - Class of 24 started with a 71%
     Freshman On Track rate.
- 78.7% of class of 2027 9th graders ended the year on track.
- Average daily attendance was 86.2%, up from 85.7% for the 23 school year, and 82.1% of 21-22 school year before.

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- 5 Essentials survey completion was 94% for students & 85% for staff
  - Ambitious instruction is higher than last year
  - Developing and engaging in building-wide practices to increase student & staff community engagement is one of our SIP goals.
- Slight decrease in ELA & Math proficiency but Illinois Science Assessment was 58% which is above the state average.









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- Graduation Rate is higher for all sub groups.
  - Black students (18 students) grad rate increased from 56% to 69%still lowest performing sub group and we will continue to focus on this.

- Freshman on Track (FOT) 79% up from 73% last year
  - Black students FOT 66% up from 44% last year
  - 2 or more races FOT 72% up from 59% last year.
