## **Areas of Growth**

### Attendance:

As we close in on State Testing and near the end of the year, attendance is crucial. We will be sending out messages to guardians asking to make sure those students are in school and will be even more diligent in our calls home. In setting a standard and expectations for being in school, our enrollment has declined. Once absent for 10 straight days, students are supposed to be dropped from the role. We have made it a priority to follow the State mandate on this. Which leads to.....

### Student accountability:

We have made a huge effort toward student accountability. This has taken on a few different meanings, but we are still adamant this is necessary for the future academic success of the students. The collective HMS GPA has lowered slightly, because we aren't just passing, excusing, or not collecting assigned work. Students are being held accountable for work assigned, staying in class, and their behavior. This is going to lead to greater learning gains and academic potential. The hallways have improved and student work has increased. Behavior, overall, has improved over the last couple of months.

## Vaping:
