physical books, then celebrated with a publishing party! Our **clubs and intramurals** continue to offer opportunities for students to connect outside the classroom. A special thank you to Mr. Foley, who has coached intramurals all year, and to Ms. Dudasik, Mrs. Mastny & Ms. Heniff, who have all taken on new student-created clubs.

Our 3rd grade participated in the city of Darien's **Arbor Day celebration**. In our own classrooms, students grew butterflies from the larva stage, where they grew into chrysalis and eventually emerged as butterflies in time for a city-wide event in Hinsbrook Park. Thank you to our teachers and students for caring for these butterflies and releasing them around our school and community! Another 3rd classroom made a significant contribution to our Federal Courts. The Dirksen Federal Building hosted a **"Justice Inspired Quote"** competition, and Mrs. Olsen's class selected one of the winning submissions! Their quote will be permanently displayed on the walls of the federal building and comes with a \$400 Amazon gift card and a replica of the quote.
