Congratulations to Divya Amirtharaj, junior at Westview High School, who was named the Grand Prize winner of the Marvel Studios Thor Ragnarok Superpower of STEM Challenge held in Burbank, California.

<u>Marvel Studios Thor Ragnarok Superpower of STEM</u> Challenge invites girls nationwide, ages 15 to 18 in grades 10 through 12, to use the superpower of STEM for good by creating and sharing an original do-it-yourself project that could help their family, their community, or the world be safer, healthier, or happier.

Divya created an app that allows visually impaired individuals to interact with the world around them. Divya attended an immersive three-day mentorship in New York City to build her STEM story, creating a professional-level video teaching other young people how to recreate her Challenge winning project. She walked the red carpet at the world premiere of Marvel Studios' Thor Ragnarok and had the opportunity to demonstrate her Superpower of STEM project live to the nation with a brief appearance on <u>Good Morning America</u>.

Steve's community advocacy for people with disabilities reaches beyond the school day and is unparalleled in our region. With determination and tenacity, Steve has organized a multi-agency effort to screen a documentary film with the end goal of increasing job opportunities for all people with disabilities –not just our students.
