Goals of the TCPP

- To expand student access to college readiness assessments and college entrance examinations
- To expand a college-going culture among all students
- To provide data on college readiness to schools and districts to help inform instructional decisions

Grade 11 College Entrance Exam Opportunity

 Approximately 60% of our students classified as 11th graders have the opportunity to take ONE college entrance exam at state expense.

• Students may register for **ONE exam, either** an **ACT or an SAT,** and the state will pay the full cost of their regular registration fees to the extent that funding is available.

TCCP Voucher Distribution Training

District level training via Region 11:

 Dec. 9 and Dec. 13—Counselors, Administrators representing all high schools

TCCP Task Force Planning Session -- Jan. 6:

- Develop Common Distribution Plan
- Provide for security of Vouchers
- Identify Role of Campus personnel in distribution
- Establish method of parent/student notification
- Provide for clear understanding of use and limits of the vouchers

Key Points about Distribution

- ONE voucher per eligible student
- Eligible students: current 11th graders only
- ONE state-funded exam per student: either ACT or SAT
- ONE state-funded administration per student: April, May, or June
- Student (not the school) has the choice of test
- Vouchers issued by school officials
- Voucher numbers recorded and secured

Strategies to Inform

- Call out to parents of juniors
- Letters about TCPP (<u>English</u> and <u>Spanish</u>)
- Flyers posted around campuses and in English III classrooms
- Teachers and Administrators informed
- PA announcements &Blue screen notice
- Information posted on campus and district websites
- Local media informed

Strategies to Expand Access

- Lists of 11th grade student TAKs scores for past two years—disaggregated
- AP Potential lists from District-wide PSAT 10th grade testing
- Economic Disadvantaged
- First Generation College potential
- Teacher/Administrator referrals
- Counselor individual meetings with Juniors

Campus Distribution

- Phone Call out to parents of all 11th grade students—Jan. 15
- Letters sent home with students
- Posting on campus and district websites
- Campus Distribution began January 20
 - Before school
 - Lunch
 - After school
- Distribution continues through Feb. 28

Which Test?

- In addition to the voucher, students are provided two informational flyers, one from each exam vendor.
- The flyers contain important information about each exam including how to register for the ONE exam of choice.
- Counselors available to advise students based on learning styles and academic history.

Refunds?

Eligible students who have already registered and paid for a college entrance exam may substitute voucher payment and request a refund:

- Instructions regarding refund requests are included on the voucher. Students must follow those instruction no later than March 15, 2011 in order to have a refund request honored.
- Exams paid for by vouchers are not refundable
- Fees for additional score reports, change of dates, or late fees are not covered by vouchers.
