## FCCLA - Sharon Pelzel

#### Lifetime Nutrition and Wellness:

Prior to Spring Break, Lifetime Nutrition and Wellness students did excellent work learning to prepare main dishes. Also, in honor of "Pi Day," they learned to prepare chocolate, pecan and apple pie, as well as cheesecake. The pies were fantastic! Students in Lifetime Nutrition and Wellness have completed their study of food-related illnesses and conditions. They are currently studying food allergies and artificial sweeteners. On average, Americans consume twice the recommended amount of sugar in their diet which is 23 teaspoons per day or about 350 calories. People then resort to artificial sweeteners to cut down on their caloric intake. The students will investigate the short and long term effects of using artificial sweeteners.

## **Human Growth and Development:**

Human Growth and Development students are currently studying adolescent development. Their studies include biological changes, as well as cognitive development and a look at the teenage brain. The next study will include development of 20 to 40-year olds.

### Interior Design:

Students of the Interior Design class took a field trip to the Dallas Market Center and toured especially vendors that relate to furniture and interiors. We were also greeted by representatives of Wade College, Merchandising and Design School in Dallas.

Students have completed design proposals for a new landscape design of the front of Aubrey High School. They are currently studying space and flow as it relates to residential design.
