We have wrapped up the DESSA screening in October. This data helps determine who is in need of additional Tier 2 and 3 services at our school.



Graduation Matters - MAST

Since June we have been preparing for the switch from giving the state assessment of SBAC to MAST as required by the Office of Public Instruction. This has required attending conferences, attending online Zoom webinars. attending district PD with the district test coordinator, aligning curriculum to the state standards and preparing teachers.

The third grade students are expected to take the MAST four times this year. We are currently in the first window of testlets that is open for six weeks. The expectation is that 95% of our students are to complete the required testlets within the window.

The following week after each testlet is given, parent reports are generated and ready for parents to view on how their child performed on the specific testlet that was given for math and ELA.

Graduation Matters

At the beginning of the year students were placed into intervention groups based on their diagnostic screener data. Each day students receive a reading intervention to get the students caught up to grade level. We just recently did our first progress monitoring on each student to assess student learning to determine if the intervention is working.

Since we have many students below grade level, teachers use different progress monitoring probes from AimswebPlus to assess students.

Our goal is to have 131 second grade students reading at 77-132 words per minute at 97% accuracy by the end of the year. Currently our data shows that there are 40 second grade students who are progress monitored on grade level for oral reading fluency (ORF).

Our goal is to have 134 second grade students reading at 102-145 words per minute at 97% accuracy by the end of the year. Currently our data shows that there are 51 third grade students who are progress monitored on grade level for oral reading fluency (ORF).

Students progress monitored with nonsense word fluency (NWF) are below grade level. NWF is a measure that begins in kindergarten to determine if students can decode the sound to blend them together to read a word.

Off grade level is the next progress monitoring step for students to read CVC words or closed syllable words in an one minute timed passage.
