Business Ethics will be part of the Business Management & Accounting program at the Advanced Technical Center (ATC), and was requested by the instructors. Securities Operations will be a part of the Financial Investment & Planning program at the ATC, and will take the place of past Innovative Courses that were eliminated by TEA and replaced with this course title. Fashion Design will be a part of the

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Fashion/Interior Design program at the ATC, and was requested by the instructors. Sports & Entertainment Marketing and Sports & Entertainment Marketing Management will be a part of the Marketing program at the ATC, and were requested by the instructors. Career Preparations I and II are replacements for the past Career Preparations courses (sometimes called "Co-op," such as Marketing "Co-op") that TEA has eliminated. Now, "Co-op" courses have been streamlined by TEA and are housed under Career Preparations I and II, but local Board approval is still required.

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
