PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

In a few short days, our seniors will step into the next phase of their lives. For the most part they are anxious for this to happen and are excited about their futures. Life is a series of milestones, but high school graduation has to be one of the most important. It truly is that event that opens many other doors to students. It is the end of childhood and a step into the "real world" that parents and teachers have been talking about for the last four years. Parents, this is the time of year to keep in close contact with the academic progress of your senior student. We have some seniors who are on a plan with counseling in order to complete all their credits for graduation on June 1st. Do not just assume that your student is doing what needs to be done. Stay in contact with their teachers, Ms. Tucker or one of the administrators to make sure your student is on target.

As the year is quickly coming to an end, we need to make sure that students have

everything that is required for graduation pulled together.

GRADES — All grades must be cleared by Ms. Tucker by 3:30 of <u>May the 31st</u>. No extra time will be given to complete coursework and to walk in graduation. If a student is failing a class or has not completed a class on May the 31st that is required for graduation, the student will not walk at the graduation ceremony. At 3:30 of the 31st, we will have the list of students who will be walking on June 4th at Graduation.

CREDIT RETRIEVAL— There are only 4 weeks left to make up any failed credits from high school. If you have classes to make up, see Mrs. Pope. She is available Monday—Thursday from 3:45 to 5:00. Take advantage of this opportunity to make up those credits needed for graduation. Seniors who have been putting this off—time is nearly out.

LIBRARY—All library books must be returned to Ms. Stehelin. If a book has been lost, it must be paid for. This is the time to do a sweep of bedrooms and other rooms in the

house to find any library books or textbooks that belong to IVHS and get them returned.

FINES AND FEES—No diploma will be issued to students until all fees and fines have been paid. Our bookkeeper has notified students (multiple times) who owe the school money. Students with fines can still walk at graduation, but the official diploma will not be given until all fines are paid.

SENIOR'S LAST DAY— Senior's last day will be on **May 31st**. They will check out with each teacher, turn in books, pay fines etc. *If they do not check out with teachers, they will not walk at graduation.*

GRADUATION PRACTICE— There are two graduation practices—both are mandatory—and students must be on time. The first is on Monday, June 3rd at 1:15 p.m. and June 4th 10:00—12:00. Seniors need to bring their caps and gowns to the Tuesday practice where a group photo will be taken. Information on purchasing pictures will be given at Monday's practice. The graduation ceremony will take place on June 4th.

AFTER SCHOOL TUTORING & HOMEWORK HELP



After school homework help is offered three nights a week from

3:45—5:30.

The afterschool bus will transport students, per the "Straight-Line" bus route, Monday through Thursday. Students who are staying for after-school tutoring and are riding the bus are expected to stay in the classroom the entire time. Students who are walking, being picked up, or driving themselves may leave when they are finished working. Students may not leave the campus and return later. Students are given a 15 minute break and snack about 4:30. There is no cost for this snack

No student will be allowed to ride the activity bus if they are not in an after school program or a sport.

We will tell the bus drivers to transport the student home, but a referral will be written, followed by consequences.

Students are required to sign in and out. If you are assuming your child is coming to after-school, you may call the school the following day to check on attendance. Many students could benefit from this extra help, so encourage your students to attend if they need the extra help.

Additionally, the computer lab is open every night between 3:30 and 4:15 Monday—Friday for student use. This time is intended for school related research and typing of reports and papers.

GRADUATION TIM

The Senior class is preparing to march in the Graduation ceremonies, which will be held on **Tuesday, June 4th**. This is a time for them to celebrate as they reflect on the past, and prepare for the future.

This is also a good time to help your student go through the checklist to verify that all requirements are met, such as sports fees, book fees, all items have been turned in, etc... This is also a good time to make sure all arrangements are in place, especially college-related paperwork.

PROFICIENCY-BASED LEARNING


Three Rivers School District has made a professional development commitment which has involved grant-based support, teachers' personal and professional investment and Professional Learning Communities beginning to adopt a Proficiency-Based approach to most of our core subjects. This change is the result of national and state guidelines giving more-explicit (and accountable) standards of content material and performance level through both performance and assessments. If your student is in one of those courses, it would be worth the time to review the syllabus from those courses, as well as the grading guidelines which may be reflected in your students' Progress Report and/or grades.

In short, the shift involves the following key components:

- Homework/Practice Work is given to help students through the exploration and acquisition phase of their learning. As they approach
 proficiency in a given standard, additional opportunities are provided for those who need more practice to be ready for the standard's assessment opportunities. Generally, this work comprises a smaller percentage of a student's grade and is graded on completion/
 participation.
- 2. Assessments are given as the larger portion of the student's grades. There are multiple chances to pass the standard and generally the grade is a reflection of either a composite score of the assessment efforts (a blend) or as the higher score. Assessments may take the form of speeches, projects, activities or traditional exams.
- Grades may change quickly/dramatically based upon the number of assessments the course has covered to date and the makeup-retake opportunities the student has taken advantage of.

If your student is being assessed based on proficiency in one or more of their classes, your student's teachers can explain this in greater detail. Please call/email the school for more information.

communicating with students, celebrating their successes. "Q" maintains all work sample records at IVHS and is a vital part to getting students to graduate.




Cheryl Hipps' work with students this year has been an important part of our success at IVHS. She has built positive relationships with students and has gone above and beyond by work-




ing at IVAC after school as a tutor for our expelled and online students. Cheryl has made tremendous strides with some of our most challenging students and has become their connection to IVHS.

County Competition - May 1st

at North Valley High School-6:30 PM

Academic Masters is a great competition that will celebrate its 26th contest this year. Grants Pass businesses first envisioned this as a way to celebrate and inspire students in the four high schools in the county who are willing to stretch themselves academically and intellectually.



At the competition, students are given a problem to solve, a question to answer, or in the case of music, an opportunity to perform. Students present to the entire audience and are scored on presentation and the correctness of the answer. The presentation and the written test together create an overall score. Students are awarded cash prizes: first through fourth place. All contestants will receive at least \$25 for competing.

This year's final contest will be at North Valley High School, beginning at 6:30 PM. IVHS can also earn \$250 for having the most people in the audience in comparison to the size of the school, so we encourage students to come support the kids in this endeavor. We are planning to run a supporter bus into town and back if there is enough student interest.

COMMUNICATIONS: SYNREVOICE—AUTOMATED VOICE MESSAGING

After receiving an automated call concerning your student's absences from our new phone messaging system, Synervoice, please call the school the next morning to clear your student's absences. number is 541-592-2116; ask for the attendance office. It is very important for you and your student to have these absences cleared. Students end up doing lunch detentions for un-cleared absences.

We will sometimes use Synervoice to send out

important messages about school closures and school events. When you get a call from the school using Synervoice, it is important that you say "hello" as this triggers the message. If you have voicemail, it will leave a message. If you have email registered with the school, we will often send emails as well.





<u>Khan Academy</u> – <u>www.khanacademy.org</u> This website has over 4,000 videos on subjects from geometry to chemistry to computer science. This is a great tool that actually reteaches the material step by step. Many times hearing the concept explained by someone else makes that light bulb turn on and the student understands. Interactive practice is also available to solidify the concepts.

<u>Sophia</u> – www.sophia.org Video clips are also available at Sophia, but there is also much more. Over 28,000 tutorials including slideshows and screencasts are available anytime. The site also tailors the information according to the student's learning style, which is determined through a short quiz.

<u>Quizlet</u> – www.quizlet.com This is a great study tool. There are thousands of flash cards & quizzes on the site developed by students and teachers from around the world in nearly every subject you can think of. Students can use an already created tool or create one of their own to challenge themselves and others in their class. This is a great vocabulary tool.



THREE RIVERS SCHOOL DISTRICT INCLEMENT WEATHER PROCEDURES

If inclement weather exists, or is forecast to exist in our school district the feasibility of providing home-toschool transportation will be discussed between the First Student busing Manager and the Director of Transportation no later than 5:30 AM.

The Director of Transportation will recommend a course of action (delay the start of school(s), close school(s), or keep school(s) open) to the Superintendent.

Utilizing the new *Synrevoice* automated calling system, all staff, parents, substitute teachers and media will be notified of the decision. The calling system sends messages both by e-mails and telephone calls (these calls could begin as early as 5:30 AM).

Important note about the calling system: It is voice activated, so the system must hear a voice when calling. This can be a live person answering the phone, your voice mail, or an answering machine. But it will not activate simply upon lifting the receiver on the phone and just listening without saying anything.

This is an automated system; an attempt to call back the identified number will not be successful. Please take the time to listen to any message left in its entirety.

All closures and/or delays will also be posted on our District website.

- If a two-hour delay is announced in a particular school or area, then school will start two hours later than the regularly scheduled time. All bus pick-up times will be two hours later than normal. School will conclude at its regular time.
- You are also advised to tune in to radio stations KAJO, KLDR, KRWQ and KBOY and TV stations KOBI (5), KDRV (12) and KTVL (10) for updates and in the event you don't have phone or internet service.
- Athletic activities, school events and other scheduled field trips could be canceled if inclement weather is a concern.
- Sometimes weather conditions leave some roads blocked or unsafe to travel, but school is still being held. Under these circumstances "straight line routes" will be run. Please refer to the "Straight Line Bus Route" attachment for your attendance area for this information.
- If you live on one of the roads the buses cannot travel, you may bring your student to the nearest intersection of the main road traveled. This will also be the stop for the afternoon drop off.

PROGRAM TO HELP HOMELESS STUDENTS AND FAMILIES

Dear Parents/Guardians,

I am Barbara Gamble, the Family Advocate for Illinois Valley High School. The purpose of the Family Advocate is to help students overcome barriers to success. I will help students acquire jackets, clothes, school supplies, hygiene supplies, glasses, dental appointments, haircuts, etc. I will also advocate for students: For example, helping them get testing or counseling, acquiring birth certificates, arranging for extra tutoring and other related services.

In addition, there is a federal law called the **McKinney-Vento** which gives additional assistance to students that meet the federal definitions of "homeless" these include:

- Living in a home with no heat or running water
- Staying with friends or other relatives due to economic hardships or loss of housing
- Fleeing a domestic violence situation
- Living in a car, van, bus, tent or other non-permanent structure

Living in one of the above situations may also entitle a student to:

- Transportation to their home school should homelessness require a move
- Immediate enrollment, even if there are issues, such as not having in hand:
- O A birth certificate(s) for the child (ren)
- O Immunization forms

RESOURCES FOR STRUGGLING STUDENTS AT IVHS

FOR STUDENTS WITH FAILING GRADES IN CORE CLASSES

If your student received a failing grade in core classes (math, language arts, social studies, health, and science), he or she has the option of repeating that class in the regular setting or retrieving the credit in credit make up. For students who have failed multiple classes over time, the only way for them to graduate with their class is to do credit makeup. Credit make up is available:

Monday – Thursday from 8:15 - 8:45 AM

Monday - Thursday from 3:45 - 5:00 PM

Please contact the school to get your student registered into one (or both) of these times. Contact Patrice Tucker in Counseling for assistance with this.

There will be afterschool bussing Monday through Thursday. The bus will leave the high school at 5:45 PM. Students who need to ride the bus and who are doing credit make-up may move into Homework Help from 5:00–5:30.

HOMEWORK HELP

Afterschool homework help will be available on <u>Monday's, Tuesday's and Thursday's</u> from 3:45—5:30 with bussing available Monday through Thursday evenings. Students can do their homework during this time with assistance from a teacher.

COMPUTER LAB

The computer lab is available Monday - Friday before school from 8:15-8:45 AM and afterschool from 3:45-4:15 PM. The lab can be used to do internet research, use Google Docs or Moodles to communicate with teachers, or to type reports and other assignments. Students may not use the lab for playing computer games, downloading music, or doing social networking.
