CES Healthy Futures Challenge

- The CES is participating in the Spring Healthy Futures Challenge through the State of Alaska once again
 this year. As you may recall, Healthy Futures is the signature program of the 501(c)3 nonprofit Alaska
 Sports Hall of Fame, Inc. Healthy Futures works to empower youth to build the habit of daily physical
 activity through core programs, such as the Healthy Futures Challenge and supporting community
 physical activity events.
- The CES Spring Healthy Futures Challenge will run for three months February, March, and April of 2022. CES students will have the opportunity to record their physical activity on the Healthy Futures Activity Log. Qualifying logs must show at least 60-minutes of physical activity during a day, for at least 15-days of the month.
