Tomahawk High School:

What a school year we had here at THS for our co-curriculars. The spring season finished great for the Hatchets, and we hit the trifecta of having state send offs for all three sport seasons this school year. Our students excelled at so many different levels throughout the year in our District, that when I reflect on the year, I could not be prouder of our students and community and what it means to be a Hatchet. Attached is a list of the overall accomplishments for our students in all activities, please refer to this with questions. I tried to keep it shorter than what it ultimately could be, but just summarizing individuals who advanced to state level competitions and or received individual awards. Some items may have been missed accidentally as we have a lot going on positively within our district walls.

The spring season was hit and miss with the weather and moving of games around the end of the school year, academic items, and completing seasons the best we could.

Baseball had their best finish in the GNC since 2018. The Hatchets under 1st year Coach John Roberts early in the year battled poor timing with scheduling and weather, along with students having college visits, and battling make up dates coinciding with other activities as always in the Spring Season. They were able to scrape together four conference wins, and were playing their best baseball down the stretch, including a tough out of the tournament in the WIAA playoffs against the conference championship team from Coleman.

Softball was very competitive throughout the season in the GNC. The GNC for softball is very underrated at times, as in Tomahawk's non conference games, they knocked off multiple state ranked opponents throughout the season when they were able to leave the strong GNC play of the conference. The softball finished the year with a story that will last with the girls forever, while trying to jump in between rain storms and senior awards night, they were over halfway to their playoff game and then informed the field was unplayable. Weyauwega-Fremont School District went above and beyond to accommodate us on the WIAA make-up date, playing an early afternoon game, and the seniors were able to return in time for their senior awards.

Track and Field had a bounce back year this year for the program. We saw a significant increase in participation numbers for both the boys and girls programs. The Girls recaptured the GNC Conference Championship for the first time since 2014. Elise Gibeault broke the school record in the 200m and the 400m. The 4x200m Relay won the Sectional and broke the school record, the relay consisted of Faith Derleth, Halle Derleth, Alicia Voermans, and Elise Gibeault. Then finally another record was broken as Ayla McCormick finally broke the discus record she had been chasing since her freshman year. Elise Gibeault qualified for the WIAA State Meet in the 400m to join the record breaking 4x200m relay at the state meet. Kurt Cordova was named the GNC Coach of the Year for the team's effort. On the boys side, the number increase helped the boys to winning the Hatchet Invitational. Patrick Samundsen was the conference champion in the Shot Put to finish out his career, along with the 4x800 relay capturing a conference championship, the relay consisted of Jeremiah Johnson, Trey Morrison, Beau Stromberg, and Sam Zastrow.
