Equitable Access to Excellent Teachers

Experienced, effective, in-field teachers – **80% of ISD 881 teachers (57/71)**

Inexperienced teachers – **21% (14/71)**

- An inexperienced teacher is defined as a licensed teacher who has been employed for three or less years.

Out-of-field teachers – **0% (71/71)**

No gaps have been identified in regard to equitable access of teachers for low-income students, student of color, or American Indian students.

The district's goal is to provide every student with an effective teacher who is appropriately licensed and has a passion for teaching, excellent interpersonal skills, a solid work ethic, and excellent classroom management and instructional skills.

Close Identified Achievement Gaps

The percent of all 3rd grade students enrolled in Maple Lake Elementary School on October 1, 2023 who are proficient in the reading accountability tests (MCA and MTAS) will increase from to 47.1% to 50.1% in 2023.

Maple Lake High School will have 100% of its students enrolled in 9th grade Civics courses during the third quarter complete a Career Investigation Unit and course plan, which includes a Personal Learning Plan.

- **Goal met: 100% participation**

Personal Learning Plans will be reviewed annually by 100% of the students enrolled in grades 10 and 11 at Maple Lake High School.

- **Goal met: 100% reviewed**

Percentage of students to earning at least one year of college credit after graduation.

77% of Maple Lake Seniors earned at least one full year of college credit.

- **13% participate in PSEO – 30% participate in College in the Classroom - 33% of 11th and 12th grade participate in at least one CTE course.**

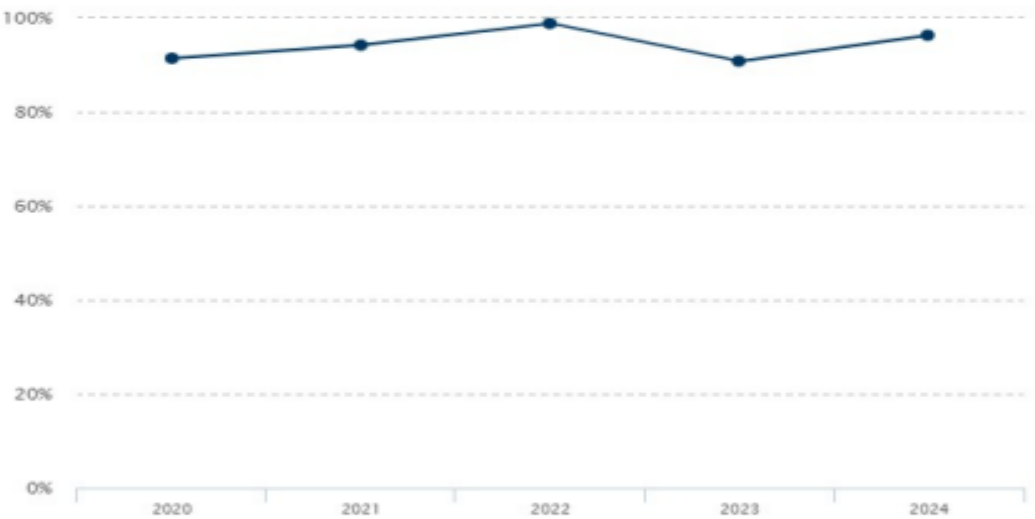
At least 95% of Maple Lake High School seniors will graduate in four years in 2024.

Graduation rate over time

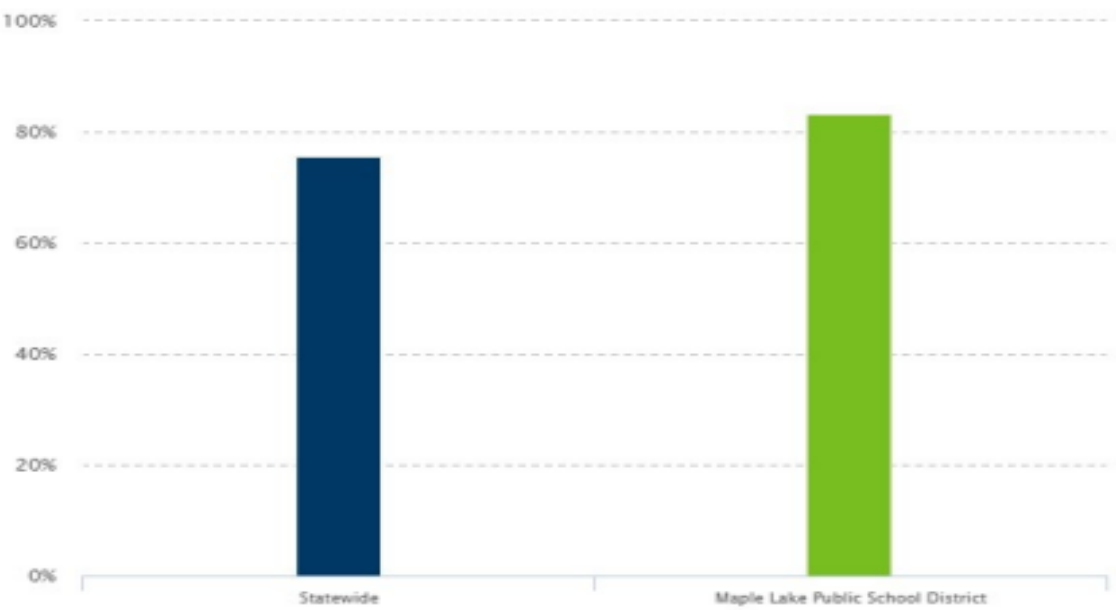
