Executive Summary Prepared for Board of Trustees Meeting 12/12/2006

International Baccalaureate Coordinators (designate) in collaboration with Curriculum, Instruction and Staff Development Division

Purpose of Report

The purpose of this report is to:

- Update the Board of Trustees about investigation progress of the International Baccalaureate (IB) Programmes in Denton ISD through December 12, 2006
- Present anticipated IB Authorization Timeline

Primary Years Program (PYP)

Newton Rayzor Elementary and Evers Park Elementary schools began investigating the Primary Years Program by visiting three authorized PYP schools in Houston. Between May 3 and May 5, 2006, representatives from the Curriculum Department, administrators from all four IB designated campuses, as well as a cadre of classroom teachers from both elementary schools met with administrators and teachers at Oran Roberts Elementary, River Oaks Elementary, and Mark Twain Elementary.

Of interest were the following:

- The involvement of pull-out programs (ESL, Bilingual, Expo)
- Departmentalized vs. self-contained classrooms
- The role of special areas (P.E., music, art, etc.)
- Training of staff members
- Funding of training
- Other expenses incurred
- Their timetable for implementation

Inspired by everything seen and heard, elementary principals Tricia Bolz and Carmen Lipscomb began selecting teachers to serve on an IBO Core Team at each campus (14 members at Evers and 13 members at Rayzor). The primary objectives of the IB Core Team were to continue the investigative process and inform campus staff members. These teams will also serve as the leaders for decision-making regarding the Primary Years Program (PYP) at each school. Subsequent steps in this investigation, to date, include:

June, 2006	IB Coordinators were designated for each campus.
July 9 – 14, 2006	Leadership team from each campus participated in Critical Friends Group (CFG) training in Houston. {Evers-4; Rayzor-4}

Note: A CFG is a professional learning community consisting of approximately 8-12 educators who come together voluntarily at least once a month for about 2 hours. Group members are committed to improving their practice through collaborative learning.

In 1994, the Annenberg Institute for School Reform designed a different approach to professional development, one that would be focused on the practitioner and on defining what will improve student learning. Since the summer of 2000, Critical Friends Groups training is coordinated by the National School Reform Faculty (NSRF) at the Harmony Education Center in Bloomington, Indiana.

Critical Friends Groups are designed to

- Create a professional learning community
- Make teaching practice explicit and public by "talking about teaching"
- *Help people involved in schools to work collaboratively in democratic, reflective communities (Bambino)*
- Establish a foundation for sustained professional development based on a spirit of inquiry (Silva)
- Provide a context to understand our work with students, our relationships with peers, and our thoughts, assumptions, and beliefs about teaching and learning
- Help educators help each other turn theories into practice and standards into actual student learning
- Improve teaching and learning

Middle Years Programme (MYP) and Diploma Programme (DP)

Principals, Darrell Muncy and Anthony Sims, accompanied the elementary personnel to visit the PYP schools in Houston during the spring of 2006. Participation of all educational levels of identified IB campuses provided an understanding of the IBO K-12 Continuum once implemented.

Coordinators and Core Teams from each school attended Level I training in Austin, July 2006 to get an overview of IBO. Teachers walked away from the training with excitement and anticipation for something they believed would challenge students to a higher level of learning. The Core teams, consisting of one teacher per subject area per grade level, will help in the decision-making process regarding the Middle Years Program at Calhoun and Denton High.

To continue the investigative process, representatives from the Curriculum Department, administrators from Evers Elementary, Calhoun Middle School, and Denton High School, as well as a cadre of classroom teachers from both the middle school and high school, met with teachers and administrators at Lanier Middle School (MYP) and Lamar High School (DP) in Houston, October, 2006. The group listened to teachers share their thoughts about being part of an authorized IB world school and also visited classrooms. Teachers were able to view the IB curriculum and strategies being taught. Physical Education and dance teachers included internationalism in their classes and make those connections to the real world which IB promotes. The teachers from both schools were very positive and the overall consensus is that IB "raises the bar and challenges all students." Our teachers made positive comments about the respect the students had for each other, the higher level of answers and vocabulary the students used, and the student-centered learning that was evident in the various classrooms.

Objectives

- Obtain guidance from the Board of Trustees regarding preparation of PYP and MYP Application (Part A) for submission prior to May 1, 2007, deadline.
- Obtain guidance from the Board of Trustees regarding continued implementation of the DP at Denton High School.

Operational Impact

Based on information garnered thus far in the investigative process, this is a <u>preliminary</u> <u>estimate of costs</u> for pursuit of PYP, MYP, DP authorization at Evers and Newton Rayzor elementary schools, Calhoun Middle School and Denton High School through the end of the 2007 – 2008 school year. The funding will be a joint effort of campus, district and federal staff development monies. Once authorized at MYP and DP levels, Texas Education Agency offers a registration reimbursement initiative for teacher staff development which the district will access.

Both elementary schools and Calhoun Middle School envision submitting Application Part A on May 1, 2007 and Application Part B on May 1, 2009. Denton High School envisions submitting their Application for Authorization prior to the June 1, 2007 deadline.
