Red Wing had a contingent of administrators and AIPAC representation present to voluntarily attend. Some of the largest metro-area districts are required to attend meetings and trainings with TNEC.
- Awaiting make-up dates for MDE Indian Education Field at Prairie Island Hearing to potentially host Commissioner of Education Willie Jett, American Indian Education Director Annie Huberty, and Tribal Relations Director Eli Dotts at RWPS. Had it scheduled for 11/17 and then Field Hearing was postponed.

# **Buildings & Grounds**

- Director Neuman has been working with the Goodhue County Sheriff's Office providing district building floorplan maps for their "School Indoor Mapping Initiative".
- Wednesday, Nov. 12th saw the third consecutive monthly meeting
  of the District Custodial Building Leads, Maintenance and
  Ground's staff, Arena manager, and our Health and Occupational
  Safety consultant, Wendy German. Also giving a report was
  Community Ed Director Bob Lawrence for the second consecutive
  month, who also took questions and gave clarifying information to
  the Buildings & Grounds team. Past guests to the meeting have
  included Jess Pena, Student Nutrition and Chris Muhvich,
  Business Office. Future guests will include our Superintendent
  and Activities Director.

#### Communication

Our objective: To help parents, students, staff and the extended community arrive at a shared understanding of the impact the FP2030 initiative will have on the RWPS District and why that is important to students.

### **Community Education**

- The Community Education Advisory Council will hold their next meeting on Wednesday, December 3rd at 11:30 at Red Wing High School. Agenda topics include a review of the MDE Annual State Report for Community Education, the 2024-2025 final budget and an update of the Adults with Disabilities program. Each meeting, Council members are given an opportunity for community sharing.
- Community Education and Recreation served 52,077 participants during the 2024-2025 program year. The department coordinated 4,187 hours of facility use for 25 outside organizations. This data

was submitted to the Minnesota Department of Education on November 1, 2025 on the Community Education Annual Report.

## **Human Resources**

- Insurance Open Enrollment is currently underway, running from November 12 through November 26.Informational meetings and help sessions are scheduled for November 20, 24, 25, and 26.
- Reconciliation and Benefits Coordinator, Laura Olson, has joined the District Office. She began her role in the midst of Open Enrollment and is currently receiving intensive training to quickly manage the benefits cycle.

# **Nursing Services**

- The nursing department is hosting two nursing students from Minnesota State College SE and acting as preceptors.
- The Care Clinic has provided dental clinics in each of our schools this fall. Over 55 students were provided services.
- All vision and hearing screenings and rescreens have been completed.

#### **Special Services**

- TBMS welcomed Tascha Kinney, a special education teacher, to the team. Her first day was Nov 10.
- The first Special Education Advisory Committee (SEAC) meeting of the year is December 9, from 4:00p-5:00p.
- November 20th, new special education staff had an opportunity to complete Crisis Prevention Intervention (CPI) Training.

#### **Student Nutrition Services**

- District wide we are focusing on hiring and filling all of the open positions. We have 2 interviews scheduled for 11/19/25 and hope to get more interested applicants. We will be notifying a candidate this week to offer the Kitchen Manager position to her.
- RWHS food pantry and a donation from the Booster club will be help fund the Thanksgiving Holiday meal boxes this year. We have the capacity to assist 30 families with this supplemental food this holiday season.
- I have submitted my resignation and will be transitioning to a new district in the coming weeks. The Nutrition Services Director position will need to be posted.

### **Teaching & Learning**

- The 25-26 Comprehensive Achievement and Civic Readiness Report has been uploaded to the website after being presented at the Board Workshop on November 10.
- The K-6 Literacy Review Committee has started exploring curricula samples from a variety of companies.
- AP Registration is complete for this school year with 187 exams ordered, ACT registration is open right now.
