#### **Arts & Curriculum**


It has now been 5 years since we started our arts initiative and joined the New Visions Network. As I worked on this year's grant, I realized how much we have grown in this area. Here are some things to note:

- Continued growth of our PreK-12th grade music programs
- Theater Productions two times a year
- Professional Concerts with our partnership with Island Music
- 5 Artist in Residencies that included theater, music, illustration and drama
- Growth and engagement of art in the Middle School-Friday art focus
- Increased engagement in singing, dancing and cultural arts
- Integration of art in the CTE setting
- Access to material and overall willingness to engage students in creative endeavors

Curriculum-Several weeks ago, we started our district wide collaboration. This happens every two weeks on Monday afternoons and is possible due to the common start time. 
### **STAFF Survey**

Fridays are helpful in providing students with interventions we can't cover during a regular day. 10 responses




Growing Leaders is a program that helps us have meaningful conversations about social emotional learning.




The assemblies on Fridays have had a positive impact on students and staff. 10 responses
