

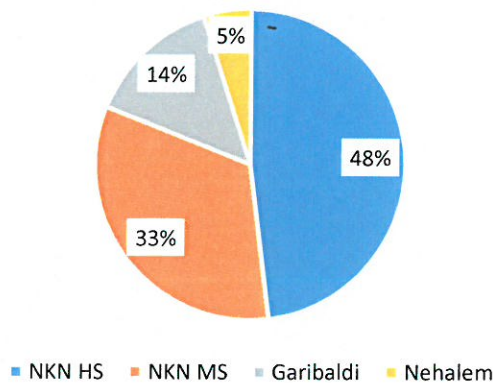


2020-21 McKinney-Vento School Board Update

The McKinney-Vento Act's Education of Homeless Children and Youth Program ensures that homeless children and youth are provided a free, appropriate public education, despite lack of a fixed place of residence or a supervising parent or guardian. During the 2020-21 school year, the Neah-Kah-Nie School District served a total of 21 students that were eligible under the McKinney-Vento Act. The percentage of the district's eligible students per school was as follows: NKN HS: 48%, NKN MS: 33%, Garibaldi: 14%, and Nehalem: 5%.

Percentage of the District's McKinney-Vento Eligible Students by School



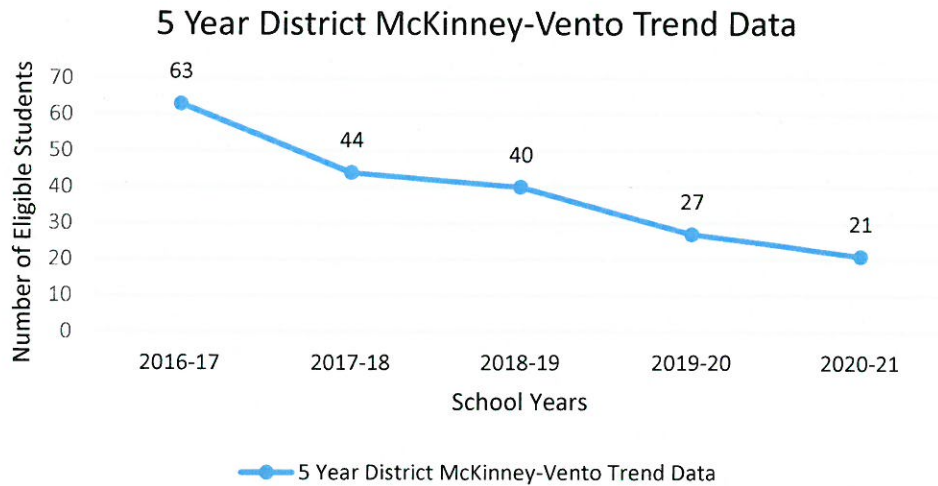
Of these students, 57% were doubled up, 33% were unsheltered, 10% were living in a hotel/motel, and 0% were living in a shelter.

DEFINITIONS

Doubled-up: sharing the housing of others, whether relatives or friends, due to loss of housing, economic hardship, domestic violence or similar reason.

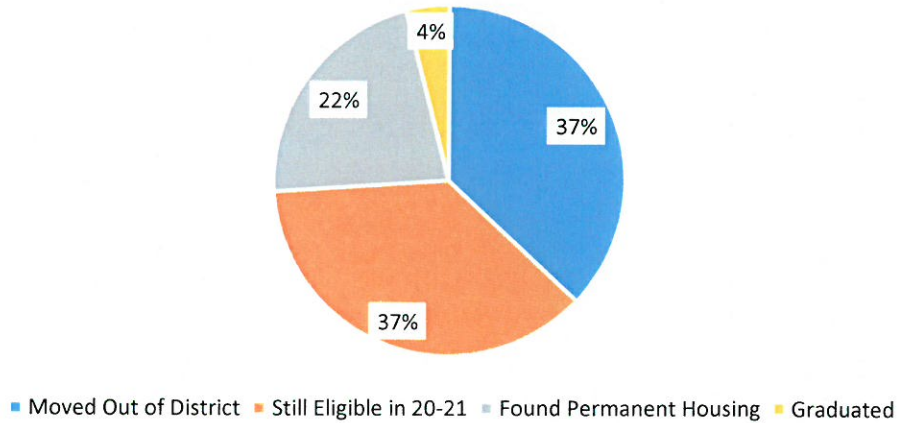
Unsheltered: living in cars, trailers, parks, public spaces, abandoned buildings, substandard housing, bus or train stations, or similar settings not designed as a regular sleeping accommodation.

Hotel/Motel: temporary commercial accommodations due to loss of housing, economic hardship or similar reason.



Due to the continuing decline in the number of eligible students from year to year, the 2019-20 eligibility data was analyzed at a one-year follow-up to determine the status of 2019-20 eligible students. The following results were found:
