Food Service Director Susan Martinic, hired just a year ago, has made significant progress in enhancing meal programs across New Buffalo Area Schools. Superintendent Adam Bowen commended her positive impact on students, while Martinic praised her dedicated cafeteria teams, noting the addition of five new staff members and their ongoing training. She announced continued free breakfast and lunch for all students through 2025–26 and highlighted efforts to connect with the community by providing fresh snacks to Flowers Learning Center and partnering with Roma's Pizzeria for Count Day. In celebration of National School Lunch Week, themed "Taste the World," international dishes were featured, and "Bring a Pal to Lunch Day" drew strong parent participation. Martinic also discussed new nutritional standards focused on reducing added sugars and sodium, as well as procedures for managing student food allergies through detailed menu tracking.

12. Remarks from the Superintendent

- On Friday, all teachers and administrators attended the Ed Forward Conference at St. Joseph High School, which brought together approximately 1,200 educators for professional development. A variety of topics were offered in breakout sessions to ensure there was something relevant for everyone. This is the second year of the conference, which was designed in collaboration with the Berrien County Superintendents' group.
- Homecoming is taking place this week, with a variety of festivities planned throughout. The week will culminate with the football game against Bridgman on Friday at 7:00 PM.
- Bison Preserve The district's prior development agreement with the Bradford Group has expired and was not renewed. Many agreed-upon timelines outlined in the original agreement were not met, and as a result, that partnership will not be moving forward. The district will now explore other potential opportunities for the property that align with our community's interests and the Board's vision.
- Baseball / Softball Field Update The artificial turf installation at both fields is now complete. The next steps include installation of the backstop netting and padded wall systems. At the baseball field, irrigation and sod installation are scheduled for this week. Once that work is complete, fencing will be attached to the installed fence poles, which will largely wrap up the project—aside from the Building Trades students constructing the baseball dugouts.
- On the softball field side, which is funded through the state grant and includes pathways and access to the park, ADA-compliant features, dugouts, and bleachers—the project recently went out to bid. Two bids were received last week, and those are currently under review. The NBARA is scheduled to meet on Thursday with the goal of awarding the bid at that time.
- Tomorrow, the high school students will visit Valparaiso University for their college visit. According to Tracy Ripley, Valpo is a new destination for our students and one that has not been explored in previous years. Traditionally, our college visits have focused on Michigan-based public universities, making this trip a unique opportunity for students to explore a different type of institution.

- The Service League Annual Arts and Craft Show will take place this Saturday from 9:30-4:00 at New Buffalo High school in both the gold and blue gyms.
- Staff members at all three buildings will have the opportunity to ask questions and gain a better understanding of district initiatives through "Coffee with the Superintendent." This program is designed to foster increased engagement and communication with staff members.
