3. Building & Facilities Report <u>Capital Improvements Project Updates</u>

- We installed a new Scoreboard-JV soccer and JV football and youth organization gave \$5000
- Portable Units-power needs to be installed and then finish flooring. District Office portable needs power and the north portable is being occupied and serving students.
- District Energy Audit- This was completed just before the pandemic by North Coast Electric, following up. Director Walperwould like to see the ROI. Is there a penalty clause with the vendor?
- Superintendent Carpenter- met with Bill Highland, big investor in Estacada and we are in talks of him willing to offset the costs.

North Complex: Concession/Restroom Facility

- Adding single/family bathrooms

 - Oct- General fund is 2.1 million expenditures are over 2.6 million not many adjustments to be made year to date we have 18.3 in revenues.
 - General fund revenue as of October 31st-63% in state sources, 18% in other sources, 0% in federal sources, 18% in local sources, and 1% in intermediate sources.
 - Available projected ending fund balance 4,639.007
 - Budget to actuals- 22.7% for instruction,
 29.6% support services
 - Enrollment-District total enrollment 1,727

E. Superintendent's Report

- Update on Covid 19 in Oregon
- The Delta variant is in 99% of state of Oregon.
- As the governor mandated the vaccine there was a very little increase in number of vaccinations.
- What's next? -Several articles have been published by public health specialists pondering how this ends, possibly the coronavirus becomes and endemic?
- The Process for schools to require immunizations— at this moment the governor has no intention of mandating the vaccine for kids at this time. We do not anticipate this school year a mandate will happen.

 There looks like there would be exemptions.

- The quarantine protocols are changing; however, the control is in the hands of Clackamas County Health.
- Test to stay is on the way but inventory on the tests are low at this time
- Face coverings update-There doesn't look like there will be a change coming anytime soon.

Student Investment Account (SIA) Annual Report Presenter: Scott 1.

• We conducted a lengthy process of evaluating Sullivan data, soliciting input from our students, families, staff and community to provide quidance to the district on how best to utilize the funds based on criteria and stated purpose set forth by the state.

Stated Purposes of Grant money

- Meet students mental and behavioral health needs
- Increase academic achievement and reduce academic disparities for: students of color, students with disabilities, emerging bilingual students, students navigating poverty, homelessness, and foster care, and other students that have historically experienced disparities in our school.
- 2020-21 Actual Plan-Due to significant reductions in allotted monies approximately 66% reduction we had to prioritize our original plan. Our SSA steering committee created a priority list and were able to make a few adjustments. We provided additional paras, CAN's K-5 teacher, spent considerably less on professional development for our BAL, LFA and Equity teams.

G. Discussion 8:05 p.m.

Buzz Randall Stadium

- We made a commitment is to provide safe warm Superintendent and dry. This is stated in our Strategic Plan under Up to date Buildings and facilities, strategy 2.
- This is drastically and negatively impacting our students. 5 total games in the last 3 years had to be moved because the field was deemed unplayable.
- Buzz Randall stadium is a special place of our community. Our school district has a general fund acct and capital construction account. Any improvements would come out of the capital construction fund.
- Director Walper-The need is to get the water off, either way excavation needs to happen with turf or grass.
- Director Behrman- What is lifecycle of turf field? Mike- about 10 years
- Vice Chair Shibahara- Would we be able to have a full size soccer field? Mike- yes
- Director Wheeler- How hard is it to get real numbers? Mike- I can have those numbers by next board meeting.
- Director Behrman- Regarding a safety standpoint is there any data on a turf field? What other things can we use it for that we are not already using it? Superintendent Carpenter- We have a marching band, time and space, spring. Club tournaments, and adult league sports.
- Director Behrman- By a having a turf field it will up the level of play for our students.
- Director Johnston- Tapping into our rainy day fund, what do we do if an emergency happens at the same time?
- Superintendent Carpenter-We have a contingency fund and capital construction account, which is 2 options for emergency funds. Capital construction account does not take money out of the classroom or teachers pockets.
- Vice Chair Shibahara-Thoughts on in kind donation from our community, how do we find them?
- Director Behrman- Since this is a state of emergency I would like to hear hard numbers and then get a committee to support.
- Superintendent Carpenter- At the December board meeting we will have hard numbers and decision. I would like 3 board member to help. Chair Riedel, Director Wheeler and Director Walper volunteered.
