NONDISCRIMINATION

The district shall promote prohibits nondiscrimination and an environment free of harassment based on on any basis protected by law, including but not limited to, an individual's perceived or actual race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation¹, national or ethnic origin, marital status, age or, mental or physical disability or perceived disability, pregnancy, familial status, economic status, veterans' status, or because of the perceived or actual race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, national or ethnic origin, marital status, age, or mental or physical disability or perceived disability, pregnancy, familial status, economic status, veterans' status, of any other persons with whom the individual associates.

In keeping with requirements of federal and state law, tThe district strives to remove any vestige of prohibits discrimination and harassment, including but not limited to, in employment, assignment and promotion of personnel; in educational opportunities and services offered students; in student assignments to schools and classes; in student discipline; in location and use of facilities; in educational offerings and materials; and in accommodating the public at public meetings.

The Board encourages staff to improve human relations within the schools, to respect all individuals and to establish channels through which citizens can communicate their concerns to the administration and the Board.

The superintendent shall appoint and make known the individuals to contact on issues concerning the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 and Americans with Disabilities Act Amendments Act of 2008 (ADA), Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, Title VI, Title VII, Title IX and other civil rights or discrimination issues². The Board will adopt and the district will publish grievance complaint procedures providing for prompt and equitable resolution of complaints from students, and employees and the public complaints.

Federal civil rights laws The district prohibits retaliation and discrimination against an individual because he/she who has opposed any discrimination act or practice; or because that person has filed a charge, testified, assisted or participated in an investigation, proceeding or hearing, and The ADA further prohibits anyone from coercing, intimidating, threatening or interfering with an individual for exercising the any rights guaranteed under the Act state and federal law.
