Student Activities

Professional Development & Collaboration

Staff have begun to look into our State Reporting Data. Cameron Middle School earned a score of 78% "Exceeding Expectations" for the 2024-2025 school year. We have "exceeded expectations" for the last 9 out of 10 years, with 2019-2020 having 'no score' due to COVID.

Trimester I Data:

- As of 11/13/25: 85% of our 5-8 grade students are passing ALL classes. This is a 5% decrease from this time last year, and above average for all years prior to that. Staff continue to collaborate about various methods to meet the needs of our students. (Learning Lab & Homework Help)
- As of 11/13/25: Our total days attendance is 98% for 302 students. Our total period attendance, which includes tardies, is: 5th-97%, 6th-97%, 7th-97%, and 8th-95%
- ___ CMS Students are currently receiving School Based Mental Health (SBMH) services.

11/10 - Chris Crowe, Jolene Severt, and Hans Schmidt attended day 2 of 2 refresher training in the SBIRT model. This training assists with requirements of our Stronger Connections Grant and gives us another tool in working with students.
