Nuevos Horizontes Advisory Committee Guidelines

Nuevos Horizontes is located in the heart of the Latino community. An increasingly large percentage of the Latino in Triton's district needs educational programs and services. The communities in Triton's district have a large number of new immigrants needing English as a Second Language (ESL) courses and other Adult Basic Education (ABE) programs such as Literacy and High School Completion. There is also a need for information on all the issues affecting the quality of life in the community.

The Nuevos Horizontes Advisory Committee is an informal group of volunteer representatives from the community at large, community-based organizations and Triton College staff whose common concern is to facilitate the process of education and acculturation.

The advisory committee's role is purely advisory in nature-not administrative or policy making. The committee's function is to advise and assist in program planning, not to establish or direct policy.1

The chairperson of the committee is the Executive Director of Nuevos Horizontes who receives input and recommendations from the committee and reports to the Associate Vice President of Academics.

- B. Advocate for Triton College to support the community center on behalf of the Hispanic population:

- D. Inform the community of the programs and services available at Triton College and at Nuevos Horizontes.
- E. Make recommendation which help develop new programs and services.
- F. Be sensitive to immigrant issues, and have experience working with the community.
- G. Reside or work within Triton's District.
- H. Support events and activities needed to fulfill Nuevos Horizontes' Mission.
- I. Know about programs and services available at Nuevos Horizontes.
- J. Serve a minimum of two years with the option of term renewal.
