Academic Excellence Tie-Breakers - Determining the academic excellence scholarship winner currently follows three steps:

1. High GPA
2. High ACT
3. Coin Flip

This past year we had 8 students who tied for a high GPA with a 4.0. Furthermore, there were three students that had the exact same ACT composite score. We have to submit an order of students to the state so that if the “first” place student goes out of state, the scholarship moves to the student in the next position. This year, we had to go to a coin flip to determine the order of students for spots 3, 4, and 5. Looking ahead to next year’s seniors, we have 7 students with 4.0’s so there will be a need to go through the tie-breaker steps again. Beginning next year, we would like to change the steps to the following:

1. High GPA
2. High ACT
3. Highest ACT on 1st attempt
4. High PSAT
5. Board Decision based on completed application

We would communicate the change in the tie-breaking system through a letter to the families of the current 4.0 juniors, and also in the student handbook.
