#### **ASBVI Enrollment: 64 students**

We enrolled two new 4th grade students.

# **Human Capital Updates**

ASBVI continues to struggle with filling vacant positions. The following positions are currently open and advertised:

- Teacher Supervisor (Interviews currently being conducted)
- Teacher–Special Education (Recommendation made and offer letter extended)
- Teacher-Gifted and Talented (shared with ASD)--no qualified applicants
- Teacher–Science 7-12 (working with ASD to see if we can share resources)

We have hired a new teacher, Josie Hall, who will be working with our Pre-K program. Miss Hall is an ASBVI alumnus and recent graduate from Harding University. We are excited to have Miss Hall on board.

Staffing for the infirmary is approaching critical mass. We currently have openings for a Registered Nurse Supervisor, Registered Nurse, and a Licensed Practical Nurse. We have conducted interviews for the Registered Nurse and Licensed Practical Nurse positions, and hope to have those positions filled by February 1. We are currently relying on contract services for nursing in order to provide proper staffing coverage.



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#### **Building Project Developments**

On Tuesday, January 14, the architect team met with specialty teachers, therapists, cafeteria managers, and the security team to gather feedback on design considerations for the new construction project. During the meeting, participants examined various layout options and shared insights on how these configurations could optimize their ability to deliver services effectively to students. The input provided will play a critical role as the architects integrate these considerations into the overall design in order to ensure the new spaces meet the unique needs of the school community.

#### **Parent Square Communication Platform Coming to ASBVI**

After significant troubleshooting involving our technology team and DIS and DESE officials, ASBVI is excited to announce the activation of the Parent Square Communication Platform. This new tool will enhance our ability to keep parents informed about campus events and updates. During a recent pilot, the platform was used to send inclement weather notifications, receiving positive feedback from both parents and staff. Parent Square seamlessly integrates with eSchool, automatically pulling contact information with changes applied through a nightly pull. While we plan to transition to using Parent Square exclusively for communication, staff training and parent information sessions are still needed. In the meantime, email will remain an active channel for updates until the system is fully implemented.

## Commencement of 95th General Assembly and ASBVI Biennial Report

The regular legislative session for the 95th General Assembly convened at noon on Monday, January 13, and the regular session will last until April. During the next few months, several bills around education will be submitted for consideration into law, including some crucial ones directly referencing ASBVI and ASD as well as the appropriation bills for both schools. Mrs. Walsh and I plan to keep board members and stakeholders informed of developments in legislation that impacts the schools.



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One of the components of the legislative session is the legal requirement for ASBVI to provide the governor and general assembly with a report of the progress the school has made during the past two years along with recommendations for the upcoming biennium. The report was drafted and submitted on behalf of the school in accordance with the law.
