1. Provide a DETAILED RATIONALE explaining how the waiver will enhance student learning opportunities, promote innovation, or increase equitable access to effective teachers. Include information about the problem or obstacle, if any, the waiver will help the district overcome.

We, Foreman School School District, appreciate approval for the early start date giving public schools the equity afforded to other public schools in the DeQueen Mena Educational Service Cooperative in which have requested a waiver from A.C.A. 6-10-106, which establishes the first allowable day of class as the Monday of the week that contains August 19. For the 2024-2025 school year that date will be Monday, August 19.

The specific waiver being requested is to allow the applying school districts to set our school district to set the first day of class to be "no earlier than Monday, August 12."

The law as presently constructed results in a wide swing in the allowable opening date of school. At the earliest, it can be August 14, which was the case this year—fall of 2023. The latest possible first day is August 20 which, under the law will be—the fall of 2029. This waiver would allow the school to open next year and years to follow on the same relative date as this year.

#### The advantages of this waiver include, but are not limited to:

- Currently the Foreman School District is on a traditional (178) day calendar. With this waiver, the fall and spring semesters would be closer to the same length. Without this waiver, the fall semester will be 84 days while the spring semester will be 94 days, a difference of 10 days. With the waiver the fall semester will be 91 days and the spring semester 87 days, a difference of only 4 days. The more unbalanced the semesters are, the greater the issue for classes that are one semester in length.
- The alternative solution for unbalanced semesters is to not end the fall semester until after Christmas break. This results in final exams shortly after two weeks out of school, and the possibility of exams being repeatedly postponed due to winter weather.
- This waiver will give greater assurance of school ending in May rather than extending into June. Some research indicates a decrease in learning past the Memorial Day Holiday.

- Beginning school earlier automatically results in more days of instruction before spring testing. More days of instruction will result in higher test scores,
- Activities such as football will begin next fall on the same relative date as they did this fall, with or without the waiver. Therefore, a large number of students will already be on campus to practice and prepare for their activities, regardless of the opening date of school. In addition to students who play football, this would include students who participate in groups such as golf, cross country, volleyball, band, cheer, dance, Student Council, and National Honor Society, as well as others.

#### 2. Provide a detailed explanation of how the services being waived will be provided for students.

The Foreman School District will create a calendar with an earlier start date which will provide us with more flexibility throughout the school year to maximize instruction. The school year will remain approximately the same length and exceed the minimally required 1068 hours of instruction. It simply allows us to continue with a school calendar structured as closely as possible to the current one and avoids the dramatic change to the calendar which must result without the waiver. Furthermore, students' learning opportunities will be enhanced due to the number of days prior to spring testing, affording students more learning opportunities at the beginning of the year as opposed to after Memorial Day.

# 3. Provide a detailed explanation of how the district will monitor and evaluate the effectiveness of the waiver.

The district will monitor student assessment results and student attendance data related to the earlier start date to determine the effectiveness of the early start date.



# A Resolution of the Board of Directors of Foreman School District Authorizing the District to Request Waiver

WHEREAS, the Foreman School District Board of Directors is committed to providing a high-quality education to all students within the district;

WHEREAS, certain circumstances or regulations may require the district to seek waivers to better address the unique needs or challenges faced by the district;

WHEREAS, the District seeks to obtain a waiver for A.C.A 6-10-106 which requires the start of school for FY25 to be on or after August 19, 2024. The Early Start Waiver for Foreman School District is for the week beginning August 12, 2024. Reasoning for this request are as follows:

- 1. The number of days for instruction the first semester would more closely align to the number of days for the second semester.
- 2. There would be an increase in the number of days of instruction prior to spring testing rather than days after spring testing.
- 3. The ending of the school term would align to community needs for the last day of school, that being before Memorial day.
- 4. It would allow the district to keep needed professional development days embedded within the school year for ongoing professional development throughout the school year.
- 5. For inclement weather purposes, it would allow fewer makeup days before June should inclement weather or other disaster prohibit instruction during the school year.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Directors of Foreman School District hereby authorizes the district administration to formally request a waiver for The Early Start Waiver from the reasoning stated above.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Superintendent or designee is authorized to take all necessary steps and actions to submit the waiver request, including providing any additional information or documentation required by relevant authorities;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors expresses its support for the waiver request and acknowledges the importance of flexibility in addressing the unique needs and circumstances of the district.

This resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoptionion.



## 2024 - 2025 Stakeholder Survey for Act 1240 Waiver Request



    - Comment was made by Mr. Mathews that the high school bell schedule will have to be modified due to High School students having lunch too late in the day.


