



Seed to Supper A Free Gardening Class

Seed to Supper is back for its fifth year in Nehalem, and for the first time it will be at Nehalem Elementary School! This free gardening class for adults that runs for six weeks and is taught by local gardening experts and Master Gardeners. This program was designed by OSU and Oregon Food Bank to be regionally specific and provide individuals low to no cost resources for gardening.

This course has taught more than 200 local adults how to be successful and confident gardeners on the Oregon coast. Participants will receive a course book and starter supplies such as a gardening trowel, seeds and plant starts, and a certificate of completion to get them going on their gardening season. They will also learn low-cost ways to build healthy soil, plan their growing space, which crops to choose for this climate, and how to care for and harvest their bounty. These classes are open environments where people excited about gardening meet and build community.
