Management's Discussion and Analysis MCSD – Maintenance & Facilities Update –

July & August were busy months and went by quickly. Our staff worked hard to have projects completed and the buildings ready for staff and students to start the new school year.

We ordered several i-mops, two extractors, a scrubber, burnisher and swing machine for the schools that requested them. We believe investing in equipment is a responsible use of funding and helps our staff to be productive and efficient.

We installed carpet in classrooms at Sam Boardman and Riverside Jr Sr High, the Ag/Tech building at Heppner Jr Sr High has flake flooring in the women's restroom to match the men's restroom that was completed last year and the Irrigon Jr Sr High upper hallway has polished concrete floors.

Lighting upgrades that are complete or scheduled include LED lights on the outside walkway for the gym at Heppner Jr Sr High, LED parking lot lights for 6 poles at Irrigon Elementary, LED outside lighting for the soffits around Riverside Jr Sr High's main building and grounds shop and LED bulbs in the Riverside Jr Sr High auditorium.

The Irrigon Jr Sr High Track is well on its way, thanks to The Port of Morrow, Benyon/Field Turf, The City of Irrigon, Rock Enterprises, and Rock Electric. The goal is to complete the project by late September just in time for Homecoming Week.

Silver Creek Contracting have been working diligently on the Heppner Jr Sr High Baseball Practice Facility has made great progress this summer.

Final proposals for the HVAC Projects covered by ESSER II and III funds were approved by the Board in June. The controls work will be scheduled when the electrical contractors are available and may be done during the school year when possible. Equipment has been ordered and installation will be completed the summer of 2023. WTI and McKinstry are aware of the two ESSER fund deadlines of September 2023 and September 2024.
