- Park View would have to displace school's bilingual/EL classroom

Looking ahead

- Reducing class sizes has a significant impact on building space and financial projections.
- Adding staff will cause the district to go into deficit spending earlier, but the district has not seen a correlation between class size and reduced academic achievement.
- **Next steps:** The Board can consider whether they want the superintendent to make a recommendation on class sizes.

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
