SPECIAL PROGRAMSEHBBGIFTED AND TALENTED STUDENTS(LOCAL)		
NOMINATION	Students may be nominated for the gifted and talented program at any time by teachers, counselors, parents, or other interested per- sons administrators. Parents may nominate their students one time for the elementary program (k-5), one time for the middle school (6- 8) program, and one time for the high school program (9-12).	
IDENTIFICATION CRITERIA	Criteria to identify gifted and talented students shall be established in the Board-approved program Policies and Procedures for Screening and Assessment for the gifted and talented. The criteria shall be specific to the state definition of gifted and talented and shall ensure the fair assessment of students with special needs, such as the culturally different, the economically disadvantaged, and students with disabilities.	
PARENTAL CONSENT	Written parental consent shall be obtained before any special test- ing or individual assessment is conducted as part of the screening and identification process. All student information collected during the screening and identification process shall be an educational record, subject to the protections set out in policies at FL.	
SELECTION	A selection committee shall evaluate each nominated student ac- cording to the established criteria and shall select those students for whom gifted program placement is the most appropriate educa- tional setting. The committee shall be composed of at least three professional educators who have received training in the nature and needs of gifted students. and shall be established for the Dis- trict.	
ASSESSMENTS	Data collected through both objective and subjective assessments shall be measured against the criteria approved by the Board to determine individual eligibility for the program. Assessment tools may include but not be limited to the following: achievement tests; intelligence tests; behavioral checklists completed by teachers and parents; teacher nominations based on classroom observations; student work products, if available; and creativity tests.	
NOTIFICATION	Parents and students shall be notified in writing upon selection of the student for the gifted program. Participation in any program or services provided for gifted students is voluntary. The District shall obtain written permission of the students and the parents before a student is placed in a gifted program.	
REASSESSMENTS	The District shall not perform routine reassessments. Students who qualify to participate in the elementary gifted and talented program will be required to qualify again for participation in the secondary gifted and talented program. However, satisfactory performance as defined by the Policies and Procedures for Screening and As- sessment will allow qualified students at the elementary level to	

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	automatically qualify without reassessment for the secondary pro- gram.
TRANSFER STUDENTS	When a student identified as gifted by a previous school district transfers into the District, the student's records shall be reviewed by the selection committee to determine if placement in the District's program for gifted and talented students is appropriate.
	The committee shall make its determination within 30 days of the student's enrollment in the District and shall base its decision on the transferred records, observation reports of District teachers who instruct the student, and student and parent conferences.
	Students who have been actively participating in the gifted and tal- ented program in another school district will be provisionally placed into the GT program immediately upon registration based upon the following criteria:
	 <u>Student provides written documentation from the previous</u> school district to verify that he/she participated in the GT program prior to moving to Coppell <u>Student (or parent/guardian) completes the GT Transfer</u> <u>Student Application.</u>
	Transfer placement is considered provisional for one full semester. The provisional placement becomes an official placement to par- ticipate in the GT program if the student maintains satisfactory per- formance during the provisional semester.
FURLOUGH	Students who are unable to maintain satisfactory performance within the structure of the gifted and talented program may be placed on furlough by the selection committee. The purpose of such a furlough is to provide the student an opportunity to attain performance goals established by the selection committee. A fur- lough also may be granted at the request of the student and/or parent.
	A student may be furloughed for a period of time deemed appropri- ate by the selection committee. At the end of the furlough, the stu- dent's progress shall be reassessed, and the student may reenter the gifted program, be removed from the program, or be placed on another furlough.
EXIT PROVISIONS	Student performance in the program shall be monitored. A student shall be removed from the program at any time the selection com- mittee determines it is in the student's best interest. If a student or parent requests removal from the program, the selection committee shall meet with the parent and student before honoring the request.

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APPEALS	Parents or students may appeal any final decision of the selection committee regarding selection for or removal from the gifted program. Appeals shall be made first to the <u>campus</u> selection committee. <u>A second appeal may be made to the Director of Advanced Academics</u> . Any Subsequent appeals shall be made in accordance with FNG (LOCAL) beginning at Level Two.
PROGRAM EVALUATION	The gifted program shall be evaluated periodically <u>annually</u> , and evaluation information shall be shared with Board members, ad- ministrators, teachers, counselors, students in the gifted and tal- ented program, and the community.
COMMUNITY AWARENESS	The District shall ensure that information about the District's gifted and talented program is available to parents and community mem- bers and that they have an opportunity to develop an understand- ing of and support for the program.
