Semester Exams:

All 7th and 8th grade students and 6th grade students in Pre-Algebra or Art took semester finals for this year. This is the second year of final exams at the middle school and overall students did very well averaging between 70-80% on every test in nearly every class.

Semester Grades:

This year our goal at HMS is that every student passes every class. Although the letter grade of D is considered passing, we encourage students to earn a C or higher grade.
