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Information for Teachers:

Teacher Handbook goes digital! All the informational documents for procedures and processes included in the teacher handbook binder have been recreated as google docs and linked to a Google Classroom. In the future there will be no need to run paper copies for updated information. Changing information on the document will automatically update the Google Classroom document as well

<u>Crisis Management Update</u>- The information in the Crisis Management Binder has been updated and also converted into a digital format in the same way. The binder and procedures were reviewed during the building meeting on September 12. An announced fire drill (without the fire department) was practiced successfully on September 17th and a Disaster drill was practiced successfully on September 20th. New procedures were implemented that included strategically placing all students and staff in the basement level and elevating the need for anyone to remain on the main floor in the middle of the building.

- Door procedure for the front door was implemented to eliminate the need for the door to be unlocked for 7:30 arrivals for breakfast. Mrs. Millburg will stand at the door from 7:30 to 7:45 to allow students in for breakfast. Mr. Cothern will be at the door in the case that Mrs. Millburg is unavailable. A teacher greeter will be at the door from 7:45 to 8:15 for all the rest of the students arriving during that time and Mrs. Millburg will help monitor the students in the cafeteria.
- A new door handle is in the process of being replaced on one of the classroom doors that had a nonfunctioning lock. A temporary lockdown plan was in place during this time. The door is now in working order.
- A walkie talkie set of 3 was purchased for the PE teacher and the Recess Supervisors in order for the office to be in contact with those adults and students outside the building.
- I toured the Lakeland College facility to ensure adequate space to accommodate all staff and students. Additionally, I confirmed with the administrator our procedure to take shelter in the building. This would be for the purpose of an evacuation until a bus arrives to transport students to the safe place (United Faith Church) or if children are outside for PE or recess during a lockdown. Keys and security codes were distributed to the PE teacher and Recess Supervisors in the case that the facility would be closed during our time of need.



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Things at School:

Beginning of the Year conferences with teachers are going very well and there only a few more left to complete. I am seeing great teaching and student engagement during my informal walkthroughs as well.

SIP Day Reading Series Training was held on September 19. The teachers reported it being very informational and they received a vast amount of information. They really appreciated the technology assistance for this valuable component of the series.
