Dear Members of the Board,
I am urging you to stop the sale of the Salquist property, and vote to NOT surplus this critical asset. This land is located within a half mile of Kelly Creek Elementary, and sits in the middle of a neighborhood where over 700 new homes are being built within a one-mile radius. This land will be essential to meet the educational needs of our growing student population.
Allowing such a critical property to be sold without fully evaluating its long-term value to the district is incredibly irresponsible. Once it's gone, it cannot be reclaimed and we will have lost a key opportunity to plan for our children's future.
There has been no independent appraisal, no competitive bidding, and no formal vote by the school board to surplus the property, all of which are required for a legal and responsible sale of public school land. Bypassing these steps endangers the future of our students to have the educational experience that we owe to them, undermines transparency, violates legal expectations, and disrespects taxpayers.
Before considering any sale, the district must conduct a detailed, independent study to prove the property is not needed. This must account for rapid population growth and already overcrowded classrooms. Anything less is unacceptable.
At the September 4, 2024 board meeting, Superintendent James Hiu promised community engagement before any decisions were made. That has not happened. The community has been ignored and shut out of the process. I am asking you all to right this wrong while you are all still able to do so.
