FOOD BANK: Over the summer, the Homedale Elementary Lil' Pantry (H.E.L.P.) continued to run a mobile pantry one Friday each month. This delivery is run by Becky Forth with helpers Pam Gibbens, Shelly Townsend, Maricela Guzman, Isela Rodriguez and numerous other community volunteers. The mobile pantry is a semi-truck that parks in the back parking lot for approximately three hours. Volunteers unload food and people are free to walk around and get what they need. The Food Pantry has been serving between 75-90 people, or roughly 15-19 families. The summer mobile pantry served between 130 - 140 families each month! With this type of distribution, we are able to serve the community more effectively. We will still continue the backpack foods on Thursdays for the students who need them.

TECHNOLOGY: With the key shifts in English/Language Arts Idaho Core Standards, students are to digitally conduct research, and create and present material using digital resources. PTO funded 10 Chromebooks to be used in the 3rd and 4th grade classrooms. These will be split between teachers to share. Grades 1, 2, & 4 participated in a study last spring and each classroom will be receiving 3-4 iPad minis as compensation. At this point they will be using the technology in groups during workshop or learning center time to practice skills, research, create projects, and present them to the class.

MEET THE TEACHER: "Meet the Teacher" night will be held on Thursday, August 20th. Teachers will be holding five 25-minute informative sessions for their students and parents. Parents will sign up for sessions at registration. Students will bring their supplies to put away and the teacher will share the new handbook, expectations and procedures for the classroom, grade level, and school. PTO will be serving refreshments to welcome parents and students.

SUPER JOB: The janitorial staff has done an amazing job again this year. With Martha Guerrero gone, Agripina Vega Ayala and Martha Alamilla went right to work and our building has never looked better! Dan Parrill worked hard to complete the elementary maintenance list, install lights, and help out where needed. We are so lucky to have them at the elementary!
