## **Nutritious Snack Program Grant Received Again**

For the second year in a row, Unity School District has been awarded the Fresh Fruits and Vegetables Grant. The grant, awarded by the Department of Public Instruction, provides an opportunity for fresh fruits and vegetables three days per week during snack time/milk break at the elementary school. The program was very successful this past year and exposed many students to new fruits and vegetables that they may not have experienced otherwise.

## **District Enrollment Projections**

Unity School District is monitoring enrollment trends for the start of the 2013-2014 school year. Enrollment is expected to remain stable or decline slightly for the 2013-2014 school year. Summer is typically a time for families to relocate, so the most accurate information will be available in August and early September. In considering elementary section sizes, some decisions will wait until August to more accurately determine class sizes for enrollment. The kindergarten through third grade enrollment is expected to be in compliance with the Student Achievement Guarantee in Education (SAGE) grant program's requirements of class sizes of 18 to 1.

## Summer Food Service Program Going Strong!

For the fourth year in a row, Unity School District will be participating in the "Summer Food Service Program" sponsored by the US Department of Agriculture. The summer program offers children nutritious food when school is not in session. Meals are similar to those that are served during the regular school year. With this program in our school, all children in our community (and in our summer school programs) will be able to eat a healthy breakfast from 7:45am-8:30am and lunch from 11:00am-1:30pm at no cost during summer vacation on the following dates:

July 15-25 (when summer school is in session) August 19-23

All children ages 18 and under are eligible to participate (regardless of school enrollment). Children eat free and adults can purchase a breakfast for \$1.75 and a lunch for \$3.25.

Parents are asked to not drop their children off at the door to eat without supervision. There will be staff supervision during serving times for those students enrolled in summer school.

During the June Summer School Session, over three hundred lunches and one hundred breakfast meals were served daily!

## State Budget and the Impact on Local Education

The recently approved state budget sees a \$150 per pupil increase for states schools in each of the next two years in the biennium. Although an increase, the budget will not fully fund the increased costs for school districts, which vary by school district. Districts will continue to need to address the funding shortfall as they plan their educational programming for the 2013-2014 school year.

From a local perspective, Unity School District has seen its state aid decline by 15% or more each year for the past six years. The District's budget is now supported by only 14% state aid. In fact, Unity School District will see the second largest reduction in state aid of all school districts in Wisconsin, based upon a percentage of total aid. The lack of state financial support adversely impacts the District property tax levy greater than any other factor. It is a testament to how the school funding formula is becoming less effective.

The State Superintendent's "Fair Funding For Our Future" plan would address many of the issues regarding school finance. This plan, in Unity School District, would reduce property taxes and increase the state's support of our schools.
