#### PK-5th Elementary Summer School Academies

**Academy Overview:** To provide a series of Academies for all students who need summer instruction and credit for grade advancement.

#### I. Bilingual

- A. <u>Bilingual Enrichment Academy</u> is for *current preregistered and identified* English Learners entering Kindergarten and 1<sup>st</sup> grade in the 2019 2020 school year.
- B. Prekindergarten and Kindergarten English Language Learners currently enrolled:
  - PREKINDERGARTEN: <u>Currently enrolled</u> identified Pre-Kindergarten English Learners eligible for Kindergarten for the 2019 - 2020 school year.
  - 2. KINDERGARTEN: <u>Currently enrolled</u> identified Kindergarten English Learners eligible for 1<sup>st</sup> grade for the 2019 2020 school year.
- C. Pre-Registered for Kindergarten and 1<sup>st</sup> grade for the 2019 2020 school year and NOT currently enrolled in BISD
  - PREKINDERGARTEN (4 year olds): Children, who are identified and preregistered for Kindergarten as
     English Learners with parental approved placement into the BISD Bilingual Academy for the 2019 2020 school year, are eligible for summer school.
  - KINDERGARTEN: Children, who are identified and preregistered for first grade as English Learners with
    parental approved placement into the Bilingual Academy for the 2019 2020 school year, are eligible
    for summer school.
- II. Grades 1-5 Summer Academy is for district students, who failed to be promoted based on District Policy EIE Local.
  - 1. Currently enrolled students must be in grades 1 through 5.
  - 2. Dyslexia students, who are deemed eligible by the Section 504 committee, may attend summer school. Dyslexia teachers will be available at each site to work in conjunction with summer school teachers to provide additional support for eligible dyslexia student

NOTE: Students, who failed to be promoted due to excessive absences, are not eligible for this Academy.

- III. <u>Student Success Initiative (SSI) Academy</u> is for students who failed to meet the SSI Requirement in grade 5 during the 2018 2019 school year. Accelerated instruction will be provided for the third STAAR Administration in Mathematics and/or Reading. Priority for summer **2019** are the 5<sup>th</sup> grade students who did not pass the **2019** STAAR Reading and/or Mathematics. **SSI preparation classes will begin on** Tuesday, June 4<sup>th</sup> and will end on Wednesday, June 26<sup>th</sup>. **All SSI Grade Placement Committee Meetings must take place prior to August 6<sup>th</sup>, 2019.**
- **IV.** <u>Elementary Enrichment Academy:</u> Students in grades 1 -5 will be provided the opportunity to engage with real-world problems through project based interdisciplinary instruction. Participants will be selected by the campus principal. To be eligible, students must be currently enrolled and have attended the entire last six weeks of 2018-2019 school year. Students must not be participating in any other summer Academy.

#### Middle Schools Grade 6, 7, and 8 Regaining of Credit Academy

Academy Overview: To provide a series of Academies for all students, who need summer instruction for the regaining of credit.

#### I. Regaining of Credit Academy

#### A. 6th, 7th & 8th Grade Regaining of Credit Academy

- The district grading procedures require students to pass each of the core subject areas with a yearly average of 70% and pass electives with a 70% (composite) overall yearly average.
- Current BISD students, who failed to meet district promotion criteria, are eligible to attend the regaining of credit Academy.
- Students who failed to be promoted due to excessive absences are **not** eligible for the Academy.
- Only currently enrolled BISD students are eligible to enroll in the Regaining Credit Academy.
- Regaining of Credit Academy will begin on Tuesday, June 4<sup>th</sup> and end Wednesday, June 26<sup>th</sup>.
- NOTE: Currently enrolled BISD 8<sup>th</sup> graders, who took Algebra I during the academic year, and did **not** meet mastery, are eligible to attend the regaining and/or EOC test preparation at the designated summer high school site.

#### **B.** Course Offerings:

- Math, Science, Social Studies, English, Reading, ESL I, English SL, Art, and Health.
- If the student failed an elective during the regular school year, the student will need to select from the summer school electives offered in order to regain an elective credit.
- Dyslexia teachers will be available at each site to work in conjunction with summer school teachers to provide additional support for eligible dyslexia students.
- C. <u>Student Success Initiative (SSI) Academy:</u> Eighth grade students, who failed to meet the SSI Requirement (Grade 8 STAAR Mathematics and Reading) during the 2018 2019 STAAR administration(s), are eligible to attend Grade 8 STAAR Reading and Mathematics accelerated instruction classes. SSI preparation classes will begin on Tuesday, June 4<sup>th</sup>, and end Wednesday, June 26<sup>th</sup>. All SSI Grade Placement Committee Meetings must take place prior to August 6<sup>th</sup>, 2019.
- **D.** <u>Coding for Girls Summer Camp:</u> The Brownsville Independent School District in conjunction with the Texas Workforce Commision is providing a tuition-free Girls Can Code Summer Camp for female students in grade 6-8.
  - The purpose of the Academy is to offer hands-on experiences, which provide challenging and innovative concepts in learning, problem solving, and analytical skills while fostering an interest in computer coding.
  - Only current and incoming BISD 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade girls are eligible to participate in the Girls Can Code Camp.

#### High School Grades 9 – 12 Regaining of Credit Academies

Academy Overview: To provide a series of Academies for all students who need summer instruction for the regaining of credit.

#### I. Regaining of Credit Academy

- A. Regaining Credit Academy: Only currently enrolled BISD students, who failed a course(s) during the 2017 2018 school year, are eligible to enroll in the Regaining of Credit Academy.
- B. Students, who failed to be promoted due to excessive absences, are not eligible for the Academy.
- C. <u>Course Offerings:</u> Language Arts, Math, Science, and Social Studies required for graduation are offered in the Regaining of Credit Academy.
- D. <u>BISD Migrant Students</u>, who have a current eligibility supported by a Certificate of Eligibility (COE) on file at the Migrant Office, may also regain credits by utilizing the migrant lab available at their designated summer school site. Migrant students must register with their respective campus counselor. Hosting Sites: Porter Early College High School and Veterans Memorial Early College High School.
- E. <u>Dyslexia Students:</u> Dyslexia teachers will be available at each site to work in conjunction with summer school teachers to provide additional support for eligible dyslexia students.

#### **Early College High School Summer Academy**

**Overview**: Brownsville Independent School District will be offering dual enrollment summer school through Texas Southmost College and the University of Texas Rio Grande Valley for qualified high school students. Students must meet the entrance criteria for either TSC and/or UTRGV and meet each higher education partner's application deadlines.

**I. Eligibility**: Dual enrollment summer school is open to current 9<sup>th</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> grade students only. Dual enrollment summer school will be offered during TSC's and UTRGV's summer sessions, and dual credit will be awarded for only <u>selected</u> courses. Students may take up to 2 courses per higher education partnering school per summer session (2 for TSC and 2 for UTRGV).

#### Please note:

- 1) Dual credit will only be awarded for any course(s) on this list.
- 2) Summer school is at no cost to participating BISD students. Tuition and textbooks are provided
- 3) TSC will have on-line registration this year. All deadlines must be met.
- 4) Since all courses will be held on TSC and UTRGV's campus, all students must have a Bacterial Meningitis Form on file with the higher education partner when registering
- 5) Transportation is the responsibility of the student and parent(s)/guardian(s)
- 6) Meeting all deadlines is the sole responsibility of the student and parent(s)/guardian(s)
- **II. TSC Summer School Registration** –On-line registration for students with cleared folders. Folders must be completed and then cleared by TSC by the week of March 25<sup>th</sup>. For students with cleared folders only, **On-line registration April 8<sup>th</sup>-April 19, 2019.**

#### Scorpion Academy for Secondary Success (SASS)

**Program Overview:** In conjunction with school district/s, the Scorpion Academy for Secondary Success (SASS) is designed to assist any senior pending graduation due to the Exit Level End of course Exams (EOC) requirements.

Program Eligibility: Seniors pending graduating due to EOC

- Students are provided a "head start" on college by affording them with the opportunity to take up to nine college credit hours at Texas Southmost College at no cost to the students: TBA
- Along with the college courses, students are provided intense tutoring in the EOC subject area of concern; school district/TSC.

- Look at students from the Spring and Summer semesters; thereafter, look at students in April-May
- This is about completion of content and not seat time
- Teachers coming through have to complete special orientation and staff development on what this is all about-special and unique.
