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Individuals with Disabilities Education Act 2004

...a federal law that requires schools to service the educational needs of eligible students with disabilities.

- All children with disabilities have available to them a free appropriate public education (FAPE)
- Each student receives specially designed instruction to meet individual needs
- Prepare for further education, employment and independent living
- Ensure that the rights of children with disabilities and parents of such children are protected








































Eligibility to Receive Special Education Services































How Do We Provide FAPE?



Through the continuum of services!



Examples of services available at all schools are:

- Inclusive, resource academic and social/emotional supports
- Speech Therapy
- Occupational Therapy
- Physical Therapy
- Vision and Auditory Accommodations and Modifications

















Programs



Specialized programs support students that do not consistently show growth through the specially designed instruction at their homeschool.

Examples of specialized programs located at certain sites are:

- Behavior Support Programs (G.R.O.W & EDP)
- Cross Categorical Programming
- Rillito Center

















Additional Services



Homebound – Up to 4 hours of instruction time weekly.

Services to Private School – Schools in the boundaries of the private school provide services.

Extended School Year – Provided at Rillito Center every summer for students who meet the criteria.




















SUMMARY STATEMENT 1

Summary Statement 1-Of those children who entered the program below age expectations in each outcome, the percent who substantially increased their rate of growth by the time they turned 6 years of age or exited the program.

Percent of children who changed growth trajectories.

Percent of the children who entered the program below age expectations made greater than expected gains, made substantial increases in their rates of growth i.e. changed their growth trajectories.






















SUMMARY STATEMENT 2

Summary Statement 2-The percent of children who were functioning within age expectations in each outcome by the time they turned 6 years of age or exited the program.

Percent of children functioning like same aged peers when they left the program. Includes those who started behind and caught up and entered and exited at age level.










































INDICATOR 6: DISTRICT LRE DATA

Definitions

Regular Early Childhood Program: more that 50% of children nondisabled

Separate Program: Majority of children have a disability

Services Only: child is not in an LEA program or any other EC program but receives a service from the school district.






