TRAIN-THE-TRAINER (TOT)

- o Four cadres, each consisting of:
 - Assistant Principals
 - Success Coaches
 - ICCs
 - Interventionists
 - Department Chairs
- o Each cadre attended four 6-hour sessions, provided by Region 18
- o Each TOT demonstrated proficiency of their CSOPE knowledge through an assessment
- o Training was completed prior to Christmas break

STAFF TRAINING

- o Principals scheduled two 90-minute CSCOPE trainings for the following teachers:
 - All K-6 elementary classroom teachers
 - All 7-12 science and math teachers (math included due to uncertainty of when math CSCOPE will be implemented)
- o February 21st (full PD day) groups listed above will receive their final CSCOPE training

NEXT STEPS

- o Following February 21st training, all math and science teachers will have access to CSCOPE website
- o Teachers will have opportunity to go into site and become familiar with the documents, and even try out some of the lessons in their classrooms, if they so choose
- o Implementation will not be mandatory until the 2011-2012 school year
