The Southwest Legacy Titan Tennis program has seen remarkable growth and success thanks to its athletes' dedication and hard work. The Titans have made significant strides in the sport, with a strong commitment to excellence. In 2023, the team achieved a historic milestone by winning their first District 28-5A Championship, finishing undefeated in district play, and becoming the first team from Southwest Independent School District (SWISD) to win a district championship in tennis. They made history again in 2024, capturing back-to-back District 28-5A Championships, maintaining their undefeated district record.

In addition to their district triumphs, the Titans also earned the title of Bi-District Champions in 2024 and reached the Area Finals, where a strong Boerne team defeated them. The Titans are determined to build on their success in the upcoming Spring season, with high hopes for both the boys' team, which aims to defend its district championship, and the girls' team, which is coming off a runner-up finish in 2024.

The program has also seen individual players excel, with five Titan athletes qualifying for regionals in 2024. The team's goal for 2025 is to send even more players to the regional competition in May. Overall, the Southwest Legacy Titans are proud of their achievements and are excited for the future as they continue to make a lasting impact on the sport of tennis in their district.

### SWHS Volleyball Team

This year, the Dragons were a dark horse in District 28-5A Volleyball, having what everyone believed would be a "rebuilding" year. The Dragons sought to prove everyone wrong and battled in a tough pre-season and a bumpy first district match. After the first district match, Dragon Volleyball flipped a switch and won 6 straight matches, falling to McCollum to finish round one with a record of 6-2. These girls chose to rally and finished the district with an 8-game win streak, only dropping three sets the entire second round. Dragon Volleyball finished the 2024 season with an overall record of 30-15 and a 14-2 District record, winning them a second consecutive District Championship and a third consecutive Bi-District Championship. Notable finishes were a Pflugerville ISD Bronze Bracket Champions, SWISD Third place finish, District Champions, Bi-District Champions, and a third straight area round appearance. The Dragons had multiple All-Tournament selections in each tournament. Audrey Mascorro, Alana Medina, and Mayra Medina were named to the Honorable Mention Team. Deborah Alele and Amiah Gonzales were named to the Second Team All-District team. Alyssa Curd and Amaya Garcia were named to the First Team All-District Team. Lastly, Addison Bartlett was named unanimously District 28-5A MVP, San Antonio Express-News Player of the Week, and San Antonio Express-News 5A All-Area Team.
