## FPC Allen Campus Board Report February 2025

- The CDL Department has trained and tested fourteen Windstream/Kinetic employees since October of 2024. These students have come from all over the state of Texas, Oklahoma, and Alabama. We have had great success thus far in this partnership.
- TCOLE audited the testing portion of our contract on the Borger Campus on January 28<sup>th</sup>. Jaimee Coburn, FPC's Training Coordinator for TCOLE, did an incredible job through this audit with zero findings.
- The Allen Campus hosted a Community Volunteer Night on January 30<sup>th</sup> to help our eight
  Phlebotomy students get all their required sticks as part of the completion of the program. We
  had great support from volunteers with sixty-four people showing up to get the students a total of
  one hundred and ten sticks.
- Perryton High School (PHS) held pre-enrollment meetings for incoming sophomores, juniors, and seniors on February 5<sup>th</sup>. Karen Metzger, Allen Campus Coordinator, attended to help promote the P-Tech Program and dual credit offerings available to students through FPC. As a part of pre-enrollment, PHS hosted Parent Night on February 6<sup>th</sup> to educate parents on student high school requirements and opportunities available to students. Karen Metzger and Monica Hernandez attended to represent FPC and the Pathways Program.
- The Perryton Junior High College and Career Readiness classes toured all FPC facilities in Perryton in the first week of February. Over one hundred and fifty students learned about academic, CTE, and continuing education programs at FPC in Perryton. We hope to see them in a few short years as dual credit students or college students on campus!
- We have seen an increase in CDL students since the price decreased at the beginning of 2025.
   We have had 20 students in January and February classes.
- Todd and Sheri Gorman made a generous donation of office furniture, desk and office chairs,
   Canon copy machine, and miscellaneous office supplies and office décor. Most of the pieces are being used at the Workforce Development Center.
- Noon Vela, Allen Campus Advisory Board Member, has graciously agreed to donate an early 1990's model 955 John Deere tractor and a 1970's model 4020 John Deere tractor to the diesel department as project equipment for the program but specifically to be used by the hydraulic classes and the hydrostatic transmission class.
- Mary Blackwell and Cassi Laxton were featured as the Lions Club Program on February 11<sup>th</sup> to highlight the RNEC Program and its benefits to the community as well as the addition of equipment to the nursing department recently obtained through the JET grant.
