AK Star an Alaska Science Assessment

April 12 and 14 students in grade 9 will be taking the Alaska System of Academic Readiness Assessment in the areas of language arts and math. Students in grade 10 will be taking the Alaska Science Assessment. We encourage students to get plenty of rest and to do their best on the tests. These results provide data to schools, help to evaluate equity in education, and provide a snapshot on how Alaska's schools are doing. For students not testing, these will be regular instructional days.

In-School SAT/ASVAB Testing

Ms. Riedel is offering the SAT on Wednesday, April 13 during the school day. We also offered the ASVAB test in March and had ten of our students participate. Two proctors came to administer the test and then spent time with our students going over their results. Our students appreciated the opportunity to discuss those results and to learn more about themselves and their areas of strength.
