Chemistry is finishing up this year by learning about redo reaction and nuclear equations. They will be performing a half-life simulation lab at the end of the week. We are also preparing for the end of course exam and final exams.

AP Chemistry is currently working on a report and presentation about polymers - the history and current uses.

Physics is wrapping up the year with an end of course test (EOC) on Friday, May 13th. After that we will be reviewing for the Semester Final and finishing up the year.

Environmental- the students are in the middle of working on a cumulative project that encompasses everything from the year and what we have done in environmental.

Anatomy & Physiology: They are finishing their career presentations after that we will be doing two labs that involve the senses.
