

DAY 1

Saturday, 23 March 2013

Relax and enjoy our scheduled flight from CHICAGO to London.

DAY 2

Sunday, 24 March 2013

Our 24-hour Casterbridge Tour Manager/Guide will meet us at the airport and remain with us until our final airport departure.

Winchester was once the capital of ancient Wessex, as well as the administrative center for the Anglo-Saxon kings until the Norman Conquest. The city is connected with Arthurian legend and is the resting place of one of Britain's most beloved authors, Jane Austen.



Visit the remains of Winchester Castle where a round oak table, King Arthur's Round Table, is attached to the wall.





Visit Winchester Cathedral, a historic medieval cathedral possessing the longest nave in Britain. This incredible structure is the resting place of many important British figures, most notably the author Jane Austen.

We will continue to Wessex (Area), our base for the next 3 night(s). Breakfast and dinner will be included at the hotel.

DAY 3



Monday, 25 March 2013 Visit mysterious Stonehenge, a large circle of stone lintels and megalithic pillars, and one of the most impressive prehistoric monuments in Britain. Constructed approximately 5,000 years ago, Stonehenge symbolizes mystery, power and endurance.



Discover **Old Sarum**, where a Celtic hill fort, as well as Roman, Saxon and Norman strongholds, once stood. There is evidence that humans have inhabited the site since 3000 BC and it is mentioned in some of the earliest records of the country.



The charming city of Salisbury was founded in the 13th century after the settlement of Old Sarum was abandoned. The surrounding lush fields and rivers were a marked improvement over the former arid hill-top location. Today, Salisbury has largely preserved its medieval, Tudor and Queen Anne architecture, giving the city a delightful elegance.



Visit Salisbury Cathedral, one of the finest medieval cathedrals in Britain. It is well-known for having the tallest spire in the country, which we may climb if we wish. Our visit will be highlighted by the cathedral's 13th century octagonal Chapter House, which displays the finest of four surviving original texts of the *Magna Carta*.


Tuesday, 26 March 2013



Glastonbury is a town shrouded in Arthurian myth and rich in mystical association. The town was once one of the most important destinations for pilgrims in England. The most notable and popular landmarks, Glastonbury Tor and the Abbey, are all associated with the stories of King Arthur, the Holy Grail and Joseph of Arimathea.



Explore the ruins of **Glastonbury Abbey**, reputed burial place of King Arthur and site of the first Christian church in England. A cutting from the famous Glastonbury Thorn, said to have miraculously sprung from the staff of St. Joseph of Arimathea, grows within the abbey grounds and continues to astonish visitors by flowering each Christmas.



Climb **Glastonbury Tor**, located in the area known as Avalon in Arthurian legend, where it is said that Joseph of Arimathea brought the Holy Grail.



Wells is named after St. Andrew's Well, the sacred spring that bubbles up from the ground near the 14th century Bishop's Palace, residence of the Bishop of Bath and Wells. It is famous for its magnificent cathedral, but also has a charming museum featuring prehistoric finds from the impressive cave complex of Wookey Hole, located nearby.




Visit beautiful **Wells Cathedral**, highlighted by 365 medieval statues of kings, knights and saints on the West Facade, as well as the unique scissor arches in the interior.





We will also stroll along the Vicar's Close, one of the oldest complete streets in Europe.





DAY 5

Wednesday, 27 March 2013

Today we will travel from Wessex to the Stratford-upon-Avon Area. En route we will explore Bath.



Bath is a unique and beautiful city. The Romans turned it into England's first spa resort and brilliant architects created the Neo-Classical facades that fill the city and recall its Georgian and Victorian golden age. Jane Austen lived here and the peaceful beauty of the city inspired several of her works.



Visit the Roman Baths. They are extremely well-preserved and feature four main areas: the Sacred Spring, the Roman Temple, the Roman Bath House and the Museum. Step into the Pump Room, a set of elegant chambers built above the old Roman baths. The core of the Pump Room is the Grand Chamber, which looks down onto the old Roman Baths and we may have the opportunity to sample some of the spa's natural spring water.



Take a Walking Tour through historic Bath, where we will see: the spectacular façade of *Bath Abbey*, *Pulteney Bridge*, featuring wonderful views of the city and the River Avon, the *Circus* and the *Royal Crescent*, one of Britain's finest streets.

We will continue to the Stratford upon Avon (Area), which will be our base for the next 1 night(s). While here, we will enjoy breakfast and dinner at the hotel.



Situated on the banks of the Avon River, Stratford-upon-Avon is one of England's most beloved towns. Its history dates back to the Roman period, but its current appearance is as a charming Georgian and Tudor Revival market town that eagerly embraces the era of its most important former resident, William Shakespeare.



Visit Shakespeare's Birthplace, a half-timbered house preserved to reflect family life in the 16th century. The birthplace also contains a museum dedicated to the bard's life. The modern Shakespeare Centre was built next door to commemorate the 400th anniversary of the Bard's birth. Next we will visit Anne Hathaway's Cottage. The cottage provides a rare insight into the life of a

family in Shakespearean times, and many of the original furnishings are preserved inside the house.



Stop for a brief visit to **Holy Trinity Church**, the parish church where both Shakespeare and his wife, Anne Hathaway, are buried. It is located in an attractive setting on the banks of the River Avon.

This evening we will watch a Performance at the RSC theater. (subject to performance schedule)

#### DAY 6

Thursday, 28 March 2013

Today we will travel from the Stratford-upon-Avon Area to London. On the way we will visit Warwick.



Warwick, the county town of Warwickshire, lies upon the River Avon. According to tradition, it was founded in A.D. 914 and the name 'Warwick' means 'dwellings by the weir.' The most popular landmark is Warwick Castle, although the town center is also known for its historic architecture, which includes a mixture of Tudor and 17th century dwellings.




Visit imposing **Warwick Castle**, surrounded by gardens, lawns, and woodland where peacocks roam freely. This is one of England's finest castles and our tour will include the State Rooms, Great Hall, armory, dungeons, torture chamber, ramparts and a ghost tower.

For the next 3 evening(s) we will enjoy the convenience of our centrally-located London hotel, where daily breakfast will be included.



London is the largest city in Europe: quite a feat, considering its location on a relatively small island. London's location is perfect for an administrative, communications and trade center, as the Romans realized when they founded their city in AD 1st century. London is filled with countless historic and cultural treasures that meld seamlessly in this exciting, contemporary city.





Visit the Shakespeare Globe Theater Museum, housed in a reconstruction of the original theater that closed in 1642 and dedicated to the experience and international understanding of Shakespeare in performance. The museum explores the costumes, special effects, music, and printing and publishing process during the Shakespearean era.



Explore the **British Library**, containing 12 million books, manuscripts and other items. The library's fascinating collection includes such items of historic and literary interest as two of the four surviving copies of the Magna Carta, a Gutenberg Bible, Nelson's last letter to Lady Hamilton, the journals of Captain Cook, a copy of *The Canterbury Tales* from 1410 and manuscripts of *Beowulf*. Almost every major author, including Hardy, Dickens, Austen, Brontë, and Keats, are represented in the section devoted to English literature. We can also view the *Diamond Sutra*, dating from 868, said to be the oldest surviving printed book.



Take a leisurely **Walking Tour** of **Westminster and Whitehall**, including Trafalgar Square, Whitehall, Horseguards Parade, Parliament Square, Downing Street, St. James's Park and Buckingham Palace.

We will enjoy our evening meal together in a local restaurant.

### DAY 7




Visit Westminster Abbey, where English kings and queens have been crowned since 1066. Our Blue-Badge Guided Tour will include the *Royal Chapels*, containing the tombs of the English monarchs, as well as *Poets' Corner*, featuring memorials to many famous British literary figures.

Friday, 29 March 2013



Enjoy a **Thames River Cruise**, a relaxing way to view many of London's most magnificent sights. Our trip will take us past the Houses of Parliament and Big Ben and under the famous Tower Bridge.



Visit the **Tower of London**, one of Britain's most fascinating and important historical structures. Begun as a fortress by William the Conqueror, the Tower is now primarily associated with the legendary figures imprisoned and executed here over the centuries. Our visit includes the armories, a display of instruments of torture and execution and the breathtaking *Crown Jewels Exhibit*.





This evening we will dine in a local restaurant near to **Piccadilly Circus** and **Leicester Square**, two of London's most vibrant and lively areas.

### DAY 8



Explore the British Museum, one of the most comprehensive collections of art and artifacts in the world. Highlights of our visit will include the Rosetta Stone, the discovery of which led to the deciphering of hieroglyphs; the Elgin Marbles from the Parthenon in Athens; and the Sutton Hoo Treasure.





Visit St. Paul's Cathedral, Sir Christopher Wren's Renaissance-style masterpiece. Our visit will include an ascent to the *Whispering Gallery*, an acoustic marvel in which the faintest whisper can be heard clearly on the opposite side, plus time at the *American Memorial Chapel*. If we are lucky, we will be here when the massive organ fills the entire cathedral with breathtaking music.
