



1. Reconfigure the wrestling room and maintenance spaces




i. In 2012, maintenance gave up the space for the current wrestling room

- ii. Potential health and safety hazards (CESA report)
- iii. Quotes: Electrical -\$11,000, Walls \$31,250

- 2. Remove wall from special education in the high school 1992 square feet
 - a. Have to find two classrooms. Hard to find two rooms big enough. We will likely need another special education room in 5-7 years.

3. Use mats in the Fitness Center

- a. Positives Practice after school
- b. Negatives Have to set up and take off mats.
- c. We could get a second curtain to run from the lobby to the workout equipment for \$9,378.

4. Use mats in the Elementary gym

- a. Positives A lot of space
- b. Negatives Some late practices, Everyone would have at least one late practice a week, and have to set up and take off mats.

5. Remove the Pole in the current wrestling room 1671 square feet

a. Not a viable option. The depth of the beam needed would be larger than the space available.

6. Add onto the building

- a. 40' by 60'
- b. Either off of the fitness center or by the elementary gym and commons area
- c. \$343,500 plus \$35,500 for wall pads and floor mats
- d. Total \$379,000

7. Build a Second Floor over the Fitness Equipment

- a. \$335,915
- b. Positives Own space, close to other areas needed.
 - i. Will need pads

8. AG Room 1276 square feet

- a. Too small
- b. Tear down the interior walls of the office and kiln room and take counters out.
- c. Build a kiln room next to the art room and into the guidance room.
- d. AG would move to Little Laker room and the Little Lakers would move to old wrestling room.

9. Half of the fitness center to permanent wrestling room

- a. \$88,521 plus \$47,000 for state-approved plans, inspection, and approval.
- b. Total \$135.521 + pads
- c. Positives A lot of space and dedicated room

- d. Negatives Take the space away from others.
 - i. Speed and Agility before weight room all summer 50+ boys and girls start and meet in that area
 - ii. Science Project-Engineering Design Unit
 - iii. Inside Recess we bring 5th graders up there on cold days.
 - iv. Booster Practice for 3-8th grade girls and boys.
 - v. 4th vs 5th-grade Dodgeball Tournament
 - vi. 5th Grade Brain Breaks
 - vii. Track High Jump-all season
 - viii. Golf-all season and preseason
 - ix. Other classrooms use it throughout the year for different projects
 - x. Booster Volleyball and basketball throughout the entire year
 - xi. Inclement weather outside teams like Football need a space
 - xii. A lot of community members use it throughout the year with their paid membership.
 - xiii. Community Ed events Yoga, dance
 - xiv. Fitness class uses it every day

10. Bus Garage

- a. Bathroom and changing room Two quotes are attached
 - i. Market and Johnson \$321,537 plus \$47,000 for state-approved plans, inspection and approval. Plus pads.
 - ii. J&A \$100,000 plus \$47,000 for state-approved plans, inspection and approval. This bid does not include electric or HVAC. Plus Pads

11. Guidance Counselor's room

- a. Guidance counselor could move to the IMC.
- b. Positives Could use both the wrestling room and this room, dedicated space i. Will need pads.
- c. Negatives Smaller space

12. Use mats in Commons

- a. Positives Have practice after school
- b. Negatives Poles in the way, a lot of traffic, not private

13. St Anns Church Classroom

- a. Positives A lot of space but narrow
- b. Negatives May have a funeral dinner going on at the same time as practice.
- c. Note They will not let us use the gym because they have people using it during the day and funeral dinners.

14. Clayton Classroom

- a. Positives Dedicated room.
- b. Negatives This is a one year solution. The coop will be in the last year during the 25-26 school year.
