## **Professional Personnel**

## Substitute Teachers

The Superintendent or designee may employ substitute teachers as necessary to replace teachers who are temporarily absent

A substitute teacher must hold either a valid teaching or substitute <u>eertificatelicense</u> and may teach in the place of a <u>eertifiedlicensed</u> teacher who is under contract with the Board. There is no limit on the number of days that a substitute teacher may teach in the District during the school year. However there is a limit on the number of days that a substitute teacher may teach for any one certified teacher under contract with the District in the same school year. The following limitations apply, except as follows:

- 1. A substitute teacher holding a substitute <u>eertificatelicense</u> may teach <u>for any one licensed</u> <u>teacher under contract with the District</u> only for a period not to exceed 90 school days.
- A teacher holding a valid early childhood, elementary, high school, Professional Educator
  <u>License</u> or special certificate Educator <u>License</u> with <u>Stipulations</u> may teach <u>for any one licensed teacher under contract with the District</u> only for a period not to exceed 120 school days.

The <u>Illinois</u> Teachers' Retirement System (TRS)<del>in Illinois</del> limits a substitute teacher who is a TRS annuitant to substitute teaching for a period not to exceed 100 paid days or 500 paid hours in any school year, unless the subject area is one where the appropriate Intermediate Service Center has certified that a personnel shortage exists.

The Board of Education establishes a daily rate of pay for substitute teachers. Substitute teachers receive only monetary compensation for time worked and no other benefits.

## **Emergency Situations**

A substitute teacher may teach when no <u>certified licensed</u> teacher is under contract with the Board if the District has an emergency situation as defined in State law. During an emergency situation, a substitute teacher is limited to 30 calendar days of employment per each vacant position. The Superintendent or designee <u>willshall</u> notify the appropriate Intermediate Service Center within 5 business days after the employment of a substitute teacher in an emergency situation.
