## Good Things at PHS:

- The morning CKH routine led by students and organized by Mrs. Amling has been a success. Students lead the school in Good Things, Theme Songs, Walkout Music, Shout outs and Fuel Up Fridays.
- Students have signed up for a CKH student Process Champions group. The students will be trained in the CKH process, model the monthly CKH initiatives, plan to incentivize desired CKH behaviors and have input on the process and state of implementation of CKH at PHS. There are currently 19 students signed up.
- PHS Art Club is planning a trip to the Rembrandt Society Art Convention on the U of I campus. The students meet other Art students from around the state. Normally, during the conference there are 2 guest artist speakers, two Art creating workshops, various ice breakers, 2 meals provided by the University of Illinois, an art show, an art scholarship competition, a costume contest, and so much more.
- 53 out of 54 classroom Driver's Education students have successfully passed their written exam and are eligible to obtain their DMV learner's permits.
- On Sunday, October 16, several choir students attended the musical "Hadestown" down at the Fox Theater in St. Louis. This was a great real-world opportunity for the students.
- Consumer Education classes have resumed Job Shadowing.

There has been an anticipated uptick in consequences assigned for student misconduct at the high school. There are a few reasons for this outcome. There are also research driven interventions to put into place to help remediate the issues we are encountering.

- 1. Incentives for positive behavior.
  - a. We are implementing and BETA testing a snack cart cash program to encourage desired outcomes. The program will start in the Rtl classes. Students will earn bucks for improving grade level strands and for good behavior. This program will work through the Intro to Business class. The students in the class will learn basic entrepreneurship skills as they manage all aspects of a retail business.
  - b. We are implementing an attendance incentive to allow students to earn entry to athletic events.
  - c. Student CKH Process Champions will recognize and reward desired behaviors. The first event will be a breakfast to recognize students who are put forward by teachers for being self-directed, which is the monthly emphasis for CKH.
- 2. Consistent enforcement of handbook rules and Board Policy
- 3. We are preparing to roll out a character education program in Enrichment second semester. We will use the CKH Character Ed curriculum. This will work in lock step with the student process champions group.
