<u>MSBA Leadership Conference</u>: January 15-16, at the Minneapolis Convention Center. Please let me know if you want to attend.


<u>Local Business Meeting</u> We have invited Lewiston and Altura business owners to a meeting on Thursday, November 20th at 3:30pm. This will be our 3rd meeting, since last spring. We will be updating them on the CTE space renovations, our personal skill development grading plans to more intentionally prepare students to be successful employees, opportunities for them to visit classrooms and/or students visit their locations, and a Career Fair Day (February 26th) that we are planning and hoping they will participate in. The Fair will be for students in grades 5-12.
