Discussion of E-Rate

Ernie Stripling, Information Technology Officer reviewed the status of the current E-Rate offering for DISD and how the District will benefit. The District receives a 60% discount from the FCC Schools and Library Division (E-Rate) as gauged by the districts free and reduced percentages. All equipment and services the district applies for E-Rate funding will result in the 40% encumbrance. In the projects above, the district portion for the optical equipment will be approximate cost of \$1,000,000 and the approximate cost for the network equipment for the 3 elementary schools is \$133,492.36.

Mr. Stripling presented the status of outstanding projects (optical network 2016) and new projects (3 outstanding school networks Wilson, Savannah & Stephens). Senate Bill 1 may provide \$25 million for E-Rate, to get Texas matching federal funds that improve high-speed broadband connectivity for all Texas public schools.
