The following are requirements for Live Well Goodhue County Mini-Grants:

- Mini-grants are available to communities, non-profits, child care programs, schools, workplaces, senior centers and organizations for implementing initiative/projects aligned with SHIP goals. Some projects and expenditures may require approval from the Minnesota Department of Health which oversees SHIP.
- Please ensure that your project aims to make lasting change that will affect large segments of the population with a priority for those with greater need: low-income groups, diverse populations, and persons over 60.
- A 10% partner site match toward the total mini-grant award is required.
- Mini-Grant recipients must participate in **pre- and post-evaluation** of their initiative/project.
- Mini-grant recipients must submit a **report** on the results of the initiative/project within 60 days of the completion of their initiative/project, including submitting photos that show people in action.
