- 1. Purchase chromebooks, carts, and conduct additional training for teachers to help them utilize the technology for student learning.
- 2. Our science and art departments will purchase materials and supplies so students can engage in hands-on learning experiences.
- 3. DHS administration will filter and select teacher professional development that will be most beneficial to students. The training will be scheduled and conducted in such a manner as to help the most teachers possible in the most needed areas.
- 4. Provide a personalized education for students by opening online options and credit recovery options so that each student will be enabled to graduate from high school. This will be throughout the 2022-23 school year. We will hire a part-time paraeducator to coordinate the online work of students. This paraeducator will work under the direction of the Principal and school Counselor.
