WiFi on the bus allows for capabilities of wireless security cameras for any behavioral issues on the bus if the school wishes to install them and with the ability to remotely access them to see what is happening on the bus.

Coaches could use the WiFi on the bus to update scores on their iPads on the way home from away games.

Palmer Wireless will provide back-up internet in case of a main internet provider outage.

Other wireless carriers such as AT&T and T-Mobile can use the Palmer Wireless 3G networks in the City of Becker improving cell phone coverage for many customers.
